2) Updates from the IA	RRP 2023 English and Romanian versions of the Romanian chapter of the RRP was loaded on the UNHCR website on 24 th February 2023. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Romania hosted 106,268 refugees from Ukraine (winter) Latest figures: 111,993 refugees in RO, small change in profile; increase in Temp Protect. Holders to 118,855, and a much higher number of unaccompanied + separated children (USC) to 1215- approx.. 50% increase compared to October 2022. Only around 14 per cent of school-aged refugee children are registered in official schools; only approximately 15 per cent of working-age Ukrainian nationals are formally employed in Romania. Over 90 per cent of Ukrainian refugees under temporary protection (TP) live in urban and peri-urban areas, primarily in private accommodation within the host communities. Based on the Multi-sector Needs Assessment conducted in October 2022, nearly 70 per cent of respondent refugee households in Romania currently benefit from the 50/20 programme.
