Brief update from meeting with National Authority for the Protection of the Rights of the Child and Adoption (ANPDCA) (UNICEF/UNHCR)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The meeting objective was for UNICEF, UNHCR to get feedback on the effectiveness of the group and to hear about any major changes. • The government will continue to join and co-chair the working group. • Recently, the government held a coordination meeting together with the Interagency group to link up with the different working groups set up by the government. • Children and Youth government working group is being held every six weeks. Madam Tudor requested that the CPSWG meet one week ahead of the Government working group. Meeting dates not yet confirmed. • CPSWG needs to make sure that reports and progress is also reflected in the government working groups to ensure and demonstrate we are contributing to the national response. • ANPDCA reiterated that Primero now being in place, every child accompanied or not will be registered and from that point children/families will receive the services that they need • it will be important to have all the non-governmental organizations on board and to be involved in this referral for services. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NGO/service providers to link up with DGASPC to ensure all refugee children are registered in Primero for easier access to services etc. (All partners, ongoing)

Brief overview of reporting requirements and Activity Info as a coordination tool (UNHCR)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Save the Children has begun a service mapping specifically for child protection, so their goal is to have this work first internally. • They are collecting information concerning the different services for only 5 counties in Bucharest, Galati, Suceava, Iasi and Baia Mare (Brasov can be included too). • Their goal is to finish this service mapping at the beginning of this month (to create a table with different services-address, focal point contacts and to share it with all the partners). <p>-RRP2023 Efforts are focused on supporting the government to ensure safe access to territory for refugees and third-country nationals fleeing from Ukraine, in line with international standards. -Includes the financial sectoral requirements of 34 partners.</p> <p>-Activity Info: standard reporting format for Ukraine Refugees Response in the region:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stores data on pre-defined indicators • Simplifies reporting • Enables real-time needs identification • Allows to geo-locate interventions <p>-All partners report in Activity Info (including RRP partners, UNHCR implementing partners, other partners).
