## **Meeting Minutes**

## Recording of the meeting

WHO, Save The Children, Estuar Foundation, Hias, World Vison, MDM

- WHO presented the implementation status of the IOM-funded Roster project with mental health specialists. Uipath through the Jobs4 Ukraine platform will provide a space for both national and international humanitarian organizations to be able to find mental health specialists, especially psychologists and for Ukrainian mental health specialists who are in Romania and would like to join this Roster in order to have access to various other information such as supervision or intervention groups.
- **WHO** presented the success of the Cultural Mediators and the projects they carry out in the community. An increase in the number of beneficiaries accessing MHPSS services when provided by Ukrainian specialists was recorded. WHO underlined the importance of introducing a community approach to MHPSS activities.
- **ESTUAR** also discussed the direction of moving services into the community but also the difficulty of getting beneficiaries to come to these services and access the centre in Sector 6. ESTUAR also reported that it has adapted and completed the curriculum for Support My Friend (curriculum supported by UNICEF, Save The Children and WHO). The STUAR will run projects with Project Hope to reduce sexual abuse, with partners and Local Authorities.
- **MDM** started offering psychological services through a mobile unit with the help of Ukrainian psychologists. MDM will start to offer intervention groups for psychologists working with Ukrainian refugees, given the highly traumatic nature of their work, as they themselves are among those who have suffered from the war..
- Wold Vison discussed the need for reporting, with the European Commission facing
  under-reporting of MHPSS services. He also invited partners to report on RRP
  indicators, as it is the end of the month. The WHO also presented the results of the
  discussions in Copenhagen, where all representatives of the MHPSS sector met and
  discussed the new MHPSS strategy for the next period. Under the umbrella of the
  support of the First Lady of Ukraine, the needs of Ukrainian refugees for MHPSS
  services and the need for these services to reach as many beneficiaries as possible
  were discussed.
- **World Vision** stressed the importance of community-based activities and presented a number of examples where it was important that the person providing the service was part of the community. WV presented the training programmes they are working on and the activities within Happy Bubbels and Same Play.
- The need to have more beneficiaries accessing MHPSS services.
- Gaining trust of Ukrainian refugees to access services.
