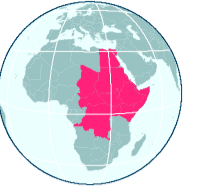

By the end of April 2023, a total of 9.25 million people remain displaced within and from South Sudan and Sudan. This includes 2.34 million refugees from South Sudan and a further 873,830 refugees from Sudan, as well as 2.26 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) in South Sudan and 3.78 million IDPs in Sudan.

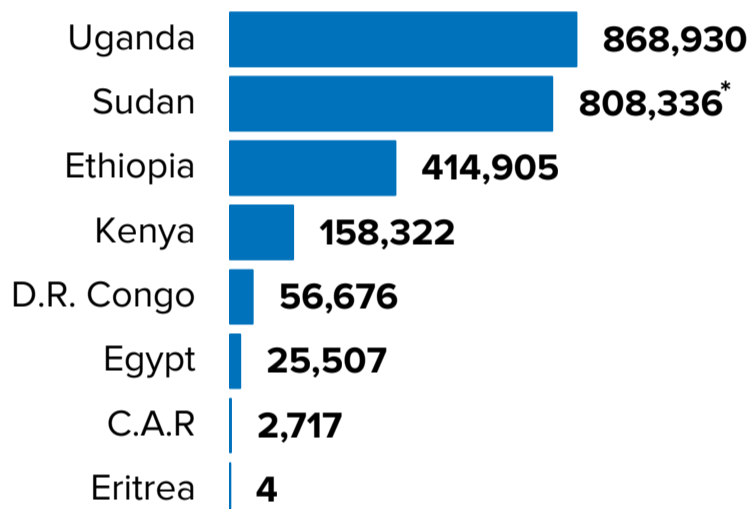

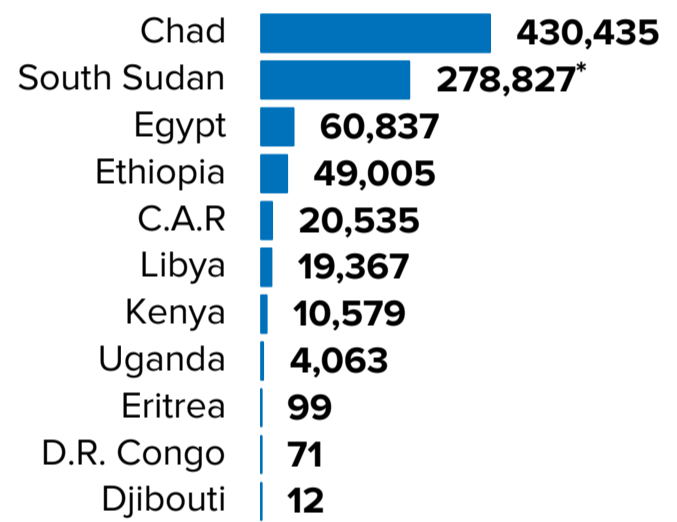

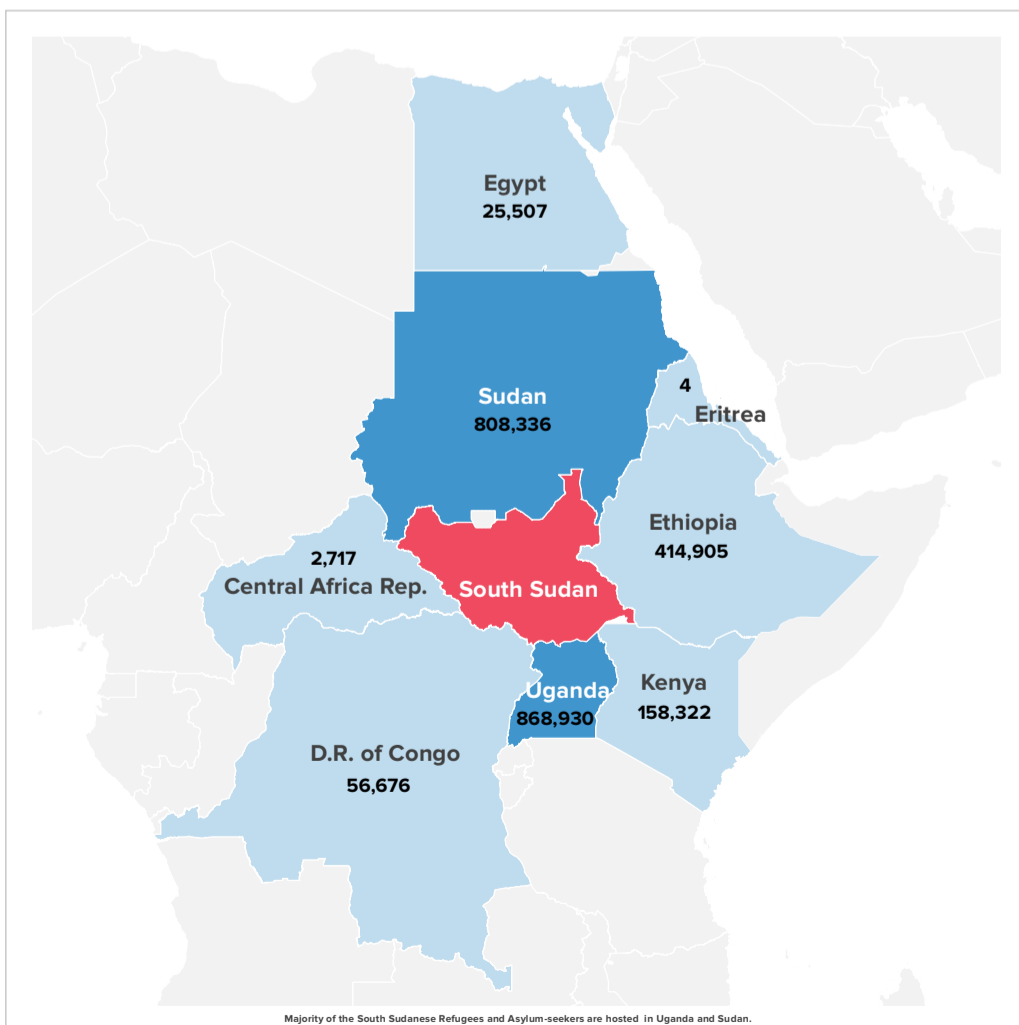

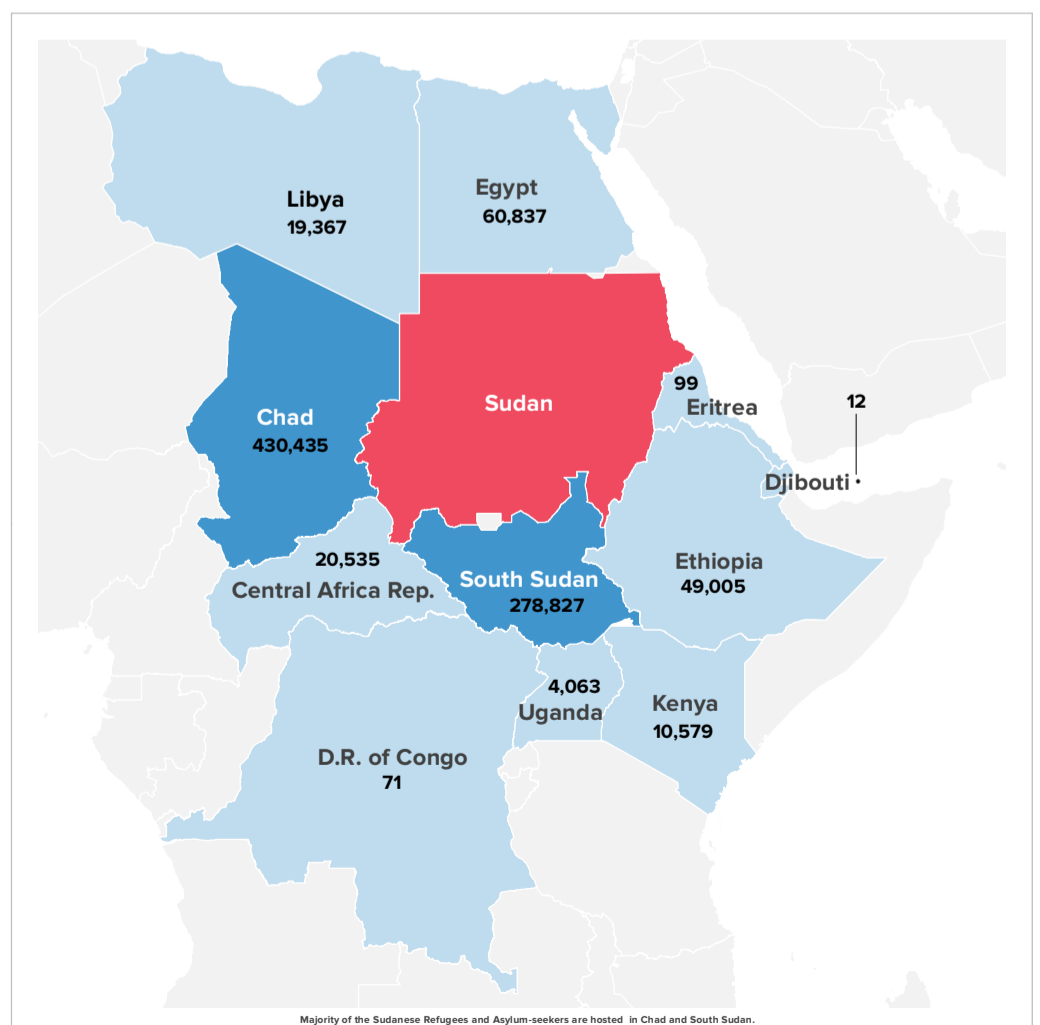
REFUGEES AND ASYLUM-SEEKERS BY HOST COUNTRIES
