

### **Solid Waste Management Program – Azraq Camp**

Increase economic self-reliance of Azraq camp refugees through environmentally responsible Solid Waste Management (SWM) incentive-based volunteer (IBV) activities

(Under the GIZ managed EUTF supported “Integrated Solid Waste Management System in Syrian Refugee Camps and Neighboring Communities affected by the Syria Crisis”

#### **Direct Beneficiaries**

3,421 Syrian refugees, starting from the age of 18 years, are going to benefit directly from the intervention by being engaged in incentivized based work activities for 40 working days each (on bi-monthly rotation). Females will be prioritized for opportunities available in the Behavior Change Campaign (BCC) and litter picking

#### **Indirect Beneficiaries**

Beyond the directly targeted groups of vulnerable families in Azraq camp, WVSR will reach all residents of the camp by improving camp environment; more than 40,000 residents have been benefiting from the services in addition to all camp actors, SRAD and security forces centers located in the camp.

#### **Program activities**

- Continue the operation of integrated Solid Waste Management in Azraq Refugee camp through the enhanced Green Centre, through collection, Sorting, Recycling and Disposing to the Landfill.
- IBVs beneficiary mobilization and selection
- Training of selected IBVs beneficiaries on Green Centre operations (waste collection, recycling and treatment of solid waste, safety procedures)
- Community sensitization and mobilization about waste segregation and environmental healthy practices
- Dissemination and collection of feedback from camp residents

#### **Program Figures:**

- Total Collected Mixed waste 17 Ton/Day in Average
- Total Recovered material 1.7 Ton/Day in Average
- Total Transferred waste to Landfill 15 Ton/Day in Average
- Monthly Cash for Work Opportunities 200 (60% Females).
- 3235 is the total cash for work opportunities created since January 2020 till May 2023.
