The Incentive- Based Volunteering Scheme (IBV) has been a key aspect of refugee participation in the delivery of humanitarian assistance and other services in the camp. 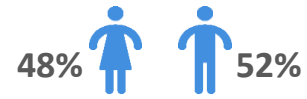

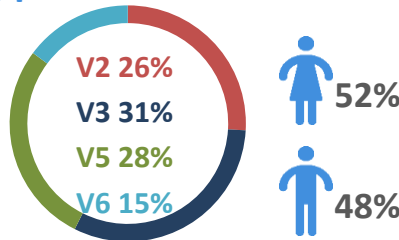

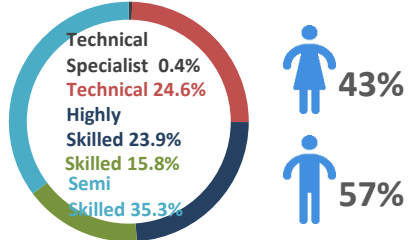

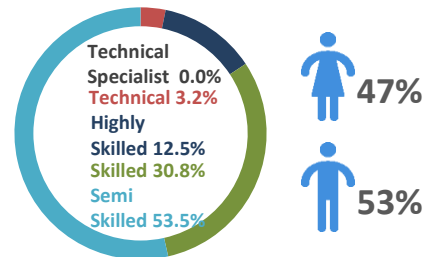

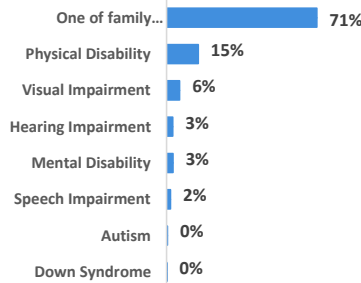

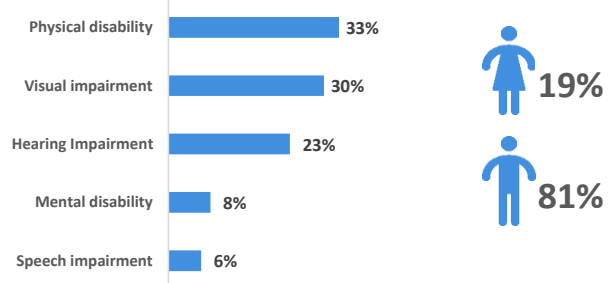
312 Total number of IBV cases rotated during September representing **18%** of total engaged with IBV

Feedback by community members:

- Community members requested to increase the IBV opportunities in response to the decrease in the amount of monthly food assistance.
- Elderly and PWD requested to consider their cases on regular rotation in IBV opportunities.
- Community members were dissatisfied with the IBV mechanism, regarding unknown opportunities announcements and unreachable. In addition, many NGOs don't rotate their volunteers.
- Community members were dissatisfied with NGOs hiring volunteers without sending their feedback to UNHCR focal points which makes duplicated IBVs.
