<p>Socio-economic inclusion</p>	<p>R1. # of people who benefitted from livelihoods and economic inclusion interventions</p>	<p>Description: Socio-economic inclusion is a process that supports refugees, stateless persons, third country nationals and other forcibly displaced persons moving from Ukraine, in integrating into the economies and social fabric of host countries. The indicator should count the total number of persons supported in their socio-economic inclusion process. The indicator may be disaggregated by the different sub-sectors as per the RIWG working definition on socioeconomic inclusion. Development programmes include initiatives by development actors aiming at supporting the socio-economic inclusion of vulnerable persons through direct assistance in the below-listed sub-sectors.</p> <p>Proposed disaggregated indicators by sub-sector: # of individuals who received support in technical and vocational education and training (TVET); # of individuals who received support in language training; # of individuals supported to access childcare and kindergarten; # of individuals who received support in accessing employment (information, counselling, coaching, mentoring, job matching) and skills (skills assessment, skills recognition, upskilling); # of individuals who received support in access to medium- to long-term independent housing; # of individuals who received support in entrepreneurship and financial inclusion; # of individuals who received support in accessing social protection; # of individuals supported with cash for socio-economic inclusion</p> <p>Excluded: Formal and informal education support for children and adolescents should be reported under R7.1 and R7.2. Awareness raising, information campaigns and online platforms aiming at informing on socio-economic inclusion issues. Support for accommodation in collective centres should not be reported here. Cash-for rent shall be reported under basic needs (R6).</p>

<p>Protection</p>	<p>R2. # of individuals who have been supported in accessing protection services</p>	<p>Description: Persons who benefit from support from humanitarian actors to access protection services in the country of asylum. It should be noted that the indicator reports as a cumulative figure the number of individuals who have effectively received those services, not those who can potentially have access. Further, it is important to note that this may include beneficiaries reported under other indicators such as MHPSS, Child Protection and GBV. Services can be provided in the context of community-based protection activities, household or individual interventions.</p> <p>Age and gender disaggregation should be systematically provided by all actors. <p>Gender Based Violence (GBV)</p>	<p>R4.1 # of people who benefitted from specialized GBV programmes</p>	<p>NEW This indicator measures the number of people who directly benefitted from specialized GBV programmes which are supported by RRP Partners and its funded partners during the reporting period. Includes beneficiaries of services and initiatives aimed at preventing and responding to GBV, e.g., case management, individual psychosocial support, as well as community based GBV prevention, such as gender empowerment and equality activities, and GBV awareness/orientation sessions. The indicator should aim to exclude double counting of people whenever possible to aim for a count of unique persons.</p> <p>Specialized GBV programmes includes services and initiatives aimed at preventing, mitigating and responding to GBV, and can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community awareness sessions aimed at preventing or mitigating GBV; • Information sessions on available GBV services; • Empowerment and life skill sessions/ initiatives for women and adolescent girls;
