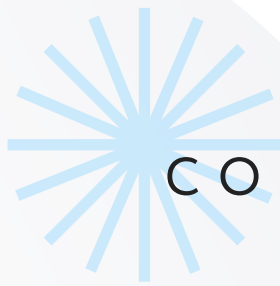

P O L A N D
 C O N T E X T U P D A T E S

Several surveys conducted by different pollsters in recent weeks and months suggest that most Poles remain supportive of the presence of refugees from Ukraine in Poland. For instance, United Surveys survey conducted in September shows that a vast majority (64.4%) positively assess the presence of Ukrainians. About 29.5% of respondents assessed their presence "rather negatively" (17.2%) and "definitely negatively" (12.3%) ([link](#)). Other polls, conducted by IPSOS and CBOS, among others, show fluctuating trends, with still a large majority showing a positive attitude towards the long-term stay of refugees from Ukraine in Poland. The latest Ipsos survey in July shows that men (66%) hold more positive views than women - 59% ([link](#)).

PESEL registration:

As of 11 September, 174,270 persons had applied for Temporary Protection (TP) in 2023 (according to government's figures posted in its data website (on 12 September) – [LINK](#)), with 7,316 recorded so far for the month of September.



MHPSS UPDATES AUTUMN 2023



- The pilot programme in Mental Health Centres was extended until 31 December 2024 by the Ministry of Health. The extension of the pilot aims to fully evaluate and adapt the solutions to the adult mental health system. So far, 82 out of 129 planned centres have been established.
- The Ministry of Health is making changes to the pilot programme for people who have experienced trauma and their families. It will also be possible to benefit from the programme if the person is in the process of a detailed mental health assessment (previously a full diagnosis had to be made in order to be enrolled).
- WHO together IPIN and with the support of MOH is introducing mHGAP program for 2 pilot regions: podlaskie and mazowieckie.

PARTNER'S UPDATES



SOLETERRE

Soletterre's psychologists in Rzeszów launched sessions of neurographics art as well as therapeutical groups to facilitate the creation of a solid and safe community network for sharing and healing together. This psychotherapy approach focuses on the pattern of interpersonal interaction of the group, used to achieve psycho-physical well-being of the participants. It is based on a common ground of suffering related to traumatic experiences, which put people closer in terms of similarities - relevant for empathizing. The main discussed topics are: grieving, lack of communication, alienation, deterioration of family relationships. Emotional feedback provide the chance of experiencing a new sense of belonging, while Gestalt approach helps living through harsh feeling and developing self-reliance.

KRISENCHAT UKRAINIAN



Krisenchat Ukrainian psychological counseling support service reached a milestone of 15,000 consultations! Krisenchat Ukrainian provides free, confidential psycho-social crisis support via chat from professional psychologists and psychotherapists. The consultations are conducted in Ukrainian, Russian and English for everybody in need, regardless of age, location, or topic. The project was launched shortly after the beginning of the Russian invasion in March 2022.

The guidance provides critical information to enable policy makers, lawmakers and other stakeholders to formulate laws in line with international human rights standards including the UN CRPD. It also offers practical information on how to develop, implement and evaluate mental health-related legislation following a rights-based process.

NOSTRIFICATION

Since 24 February 2022 (based on "Special Act"- Article 64a of the Act of March 12, 2022, on assistance to citizens of Ukraine in connection with the armed conflict on the territory of that country) psychologists could provide psychological services to Ukrainian citizens residing in Poland, including health care services in the field of psychiatric care and addiction treatment, without the need for diploma nostrification.

Psychologists from Ukraine could provide the above services if they:

1. resided legally in Poland (both on the basis of the Special Act and other acts) and
2. had a diploma obtained in Ukraine (only uniform 5 years of studies or first and second degree studies - both in psychology) completed with the title of a specialist in the field of psychology or a master's degree in psychology.

This law expired on 24 August 2023.


What happened since then?

On 22 August 2023, representatives of more than 130 social organizations made an open appeal to the Ombudsman to intervene.

The law, including the extension, was adopted by the Sejm and sent to the Senate. The amendment regarding the rights of Ukrainian psychologists was hidden in a large bill on the State Treasury's obligations to the National Energy Security Agency.

On 7 September 2023 - Senate rejected the whole act.

NGOs once again appealed to the Ombudsman, and on 20 September the Ombudsman sent a letter to the Minister of Interior and the Government's Plenipotentiary for War Refugees from Ukraine with a request to address the possibilities of solving the problem.
