

# Armenia

February 2024

In October 2023, in support to the Government of the Republic of Armenia, a joint humanitarian funding appeal, the Armenia Refugee Response Plan (RRP), was launched. It covers a six-month period from October 2023 to March 2024. The plan outlines coordinated and inclusive interventions to support urgent lifesaving needs and the resilience of both the refugee and hosting populations. This inter-agency operational update reflects the work of RRP partners and RRP-aligned partners as reported in ActivityInfo for the period of October 2023 to January 2024. Overall, 48 partners reporting across six sectors and two sub-sectors, detailing 33 activities tracked by 54 indicators, covering 11 regions. Detailed data is available [online](#).

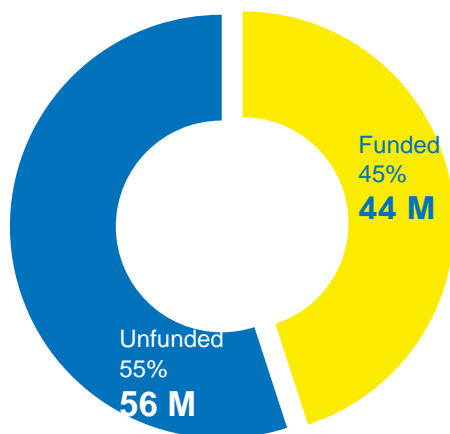
