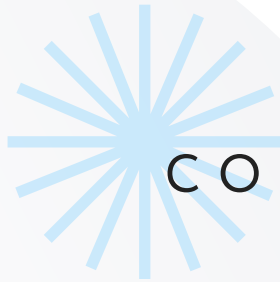

P O L A N D
 C O N T E X T U P D A T E S

The total number of border crossings from Ukraine to Poland since February 2022 to 19 January 2024 was 18,415,828 (729,777 from 04 January 2024 to 02 February 2024), while 15,783,649 border crossings were recorded to Ukraine (645,098 from 04 January 2024 to 02 February 2024). Since February 2022, 2,632,179 more entries have been registered to Poland than those to Ukraine. From 04 January 2024 to 02 February 2024, there were 84,679 more crossings to Poland than to Ukraine.

PESEL registration:

As of 02 February, 955,893 persons had active Temporary Protection (TP) status. 231,432 of them registered in 2023 alone (according to government's figures posted in its data website on 5 January), with 10,432 recorded for the month of December.

In 2023, a monthly average of 19,142 have registered for PESEL.



MHPSS UPDATES WINTER 2024

- The WHO CO in Poland conducted in January two sets of ToT in Problem Management+ (PM+): one targeting Community-based Mental Health Centers and the other focusing on civil society. PM+ is a scalable psychological intervention. Introducing PM+ in Poland aims at support of mental health reform in Poland, harmonizing care within community-based mental health centers, and addressing the substantial demand for mental health services. It is an integral part of the mhGAP umbrella.

MHPSS UPDATES WINTER 2024

NOSTRIFICATION

Despite the advocacy efforts of various stakeholders, the amendment to the Special Act that came into effect on February 24, 2024, did not address the issue of Ukrainian psychologists' ability to work without the requirement of diploma recognition. As a result, the legal status of psychologists has not changed - the right to provide assistance to Ukrainian citizens by Ukrainian psychologists without diploma recognition expired on August 24, 2023.

ARTOLUTION - FUNDACJA NA MIEJSCU & UNHCR



A series of artistic workshops for refugee children took place recently, conducted by Fundacja Na Miejscu and UNHCR as part of the Artolution project.



During the workshops, participants learned various artistic techniques and attempted to translate their personal experiences into the language of art. They painted who they are and what they like to do, the path they had to travel to be here and now, the tastes and places they have stored on their private maps of memories. There was also space to reflect on the distance separating the new reality from the sensitive points of everyday life stored in memory.



From this a map, and later a track for the bottle cap game was created. Participants, joined by their families and friends, celebrated the completion of the activities during a tournament where everyone emerged as a triumphant winner, united by the joy of creativity and community.

REFUGEE RESPONSE PLAN 2024



On 15 February 2024, Refugee Response Plan appeal event took place. In order to provide support for the most vulnerable Ukrainian refugees, 103 humanitarian organizations throughout Poland appealed for USD 377 million (PLN 1.5 billion) to help those who suffer because of the war. The vast majority of participating organizations – over 80 percent – are grassroots Polish NGOs and Ukrainian-led groups that bring together the local community and the refugee population. The appeal is coordinated by the UN Refugee Agency, UNHCR, in support of the Government.

There were 56 MHPSS partners who appealed under 3 sectors - health, protection, education, with a total budget of 22 million USD intended for MHPSS activities.

MHPSS projects in RRP 2024 focus around:

- Children's mental health - interventions for children and projects for helpers, teachers, caregivers.
- Refugees psychosocial support - MHPSS services: individual and group consultations for women and older population.
- Mental health related sectors: health, protection, child protection, and gender based violence, SRH - capacity building activities: mhGAP and scalable interventions, trainings.

Summary of the course:

The Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) Course, spanning fifteen days, constitutes an intensive and comprehensive initiative aimed at addressing the intricate challenges posed by mental health issues, particularly for people experiencing instability and conflict. It starts with foundational topics, such as creative team building and humanitarian law, then moves to advanced discussions on psychosocial support, migration, and mental health law. The curriculum incorporates diverse perspectives from esteemed trainers and professionals, offering insights into the multifaceted dimensions of mental health. Moreover, the program introduces practical elements, including needs assessment, creative sessions, and community-based interventions, ensuring a holistic understanding of MHPSS in humanitarian contexts. The culminating fieldwork period provides participants with the opportunity to translate theoretical knowledge into actionable strategies, reinforcing the practical applicability of the acquired skills. The program concludes with a participatory evaluation session and a celebratory dinner, fostering collaboration, knowledge exchange, and the cultivation of a network of professionals committed to addressing mental health challenges in Poland.
