

SOUTH SUDAN Regional Refugee Response Plan

January - December 2024

AT A GLANCE

The South Sudan Regional Refugee Response Plan (RRP) is an annual multi-agency, multisectoral costed plan to respond to the ongoing South Sudanese refugee crisis in the five main countries of asylum: the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Ethiopia, Kenya, Sudan and Uganda. The 2024 RRP is designed to meet the complex needs of over 2.3 million South Sudanese refugees and asylum-seekers alongside approximately 2.38 million members of host communities.

Covering nine sectors, the plan includes coordinated activities in: protection, including gender-based violence and child protection, education, food security, public health and nutrition, livelihoods and economic inclusion, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), settlement and shelter/housing and basic needs, and logistics and operational support. In addition, climate action as a cross-cutting issue covers energy and the environment which is a critical component in the region and the related budget implications have been indicated alongside the sectors. Each sector's approach is tailored to the unique context of the respective countries.

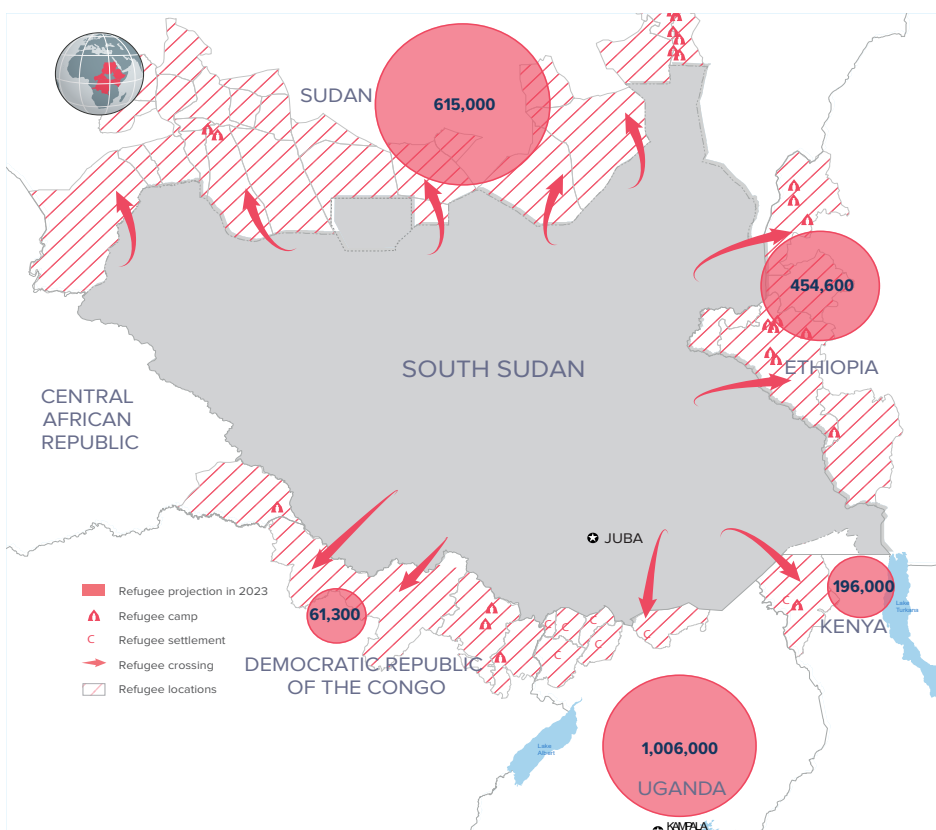

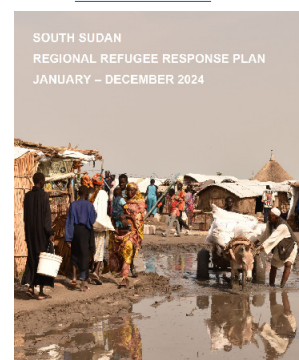

REGIONAL COORDINATION

Aligned with the Refugee Coordination Model, the 2024 Regional Refugee Response Plan has 123 partners including International NGOs comprising 64 per cent of all RRP partners, national NGOs making up 28 per cent, and UN agencies representing 8 per cent. In addition to the UN, a number of the INGOs work in more than one country of the response. The diversity of partners enables the RRP partners to approach the 2024 response with the wealth of lessons learnt and relationships with refugees, their host communities, governments and regional bodies.
