New Funding Opportunities

Title of the Call: Call for Nominations: Global Pluralism Award

Deadline: May 17th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Global Centre for Pluralism

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Individuals (e.g., artists, journalists, academics, policymakers, filmmakers, etc.)
- Civil society organizations (e.g., professional associations, faith-based organizations, labour unions, non-profit research or educational institutions, local community groups, non-governmental organizations, foundations, think tanks, etc.)
- Social enterprises
- Corporations (public or private)
- Educational, research and policy institutions (public or private)
- Local/municipal, regional, or federal/national branches or agencies of government

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Pluralism in action, recognizing, valuing, and respecting diversity.
- Building inclusive societies where diversity is valued and protected.
- Intersectionality across multiple dimensions of identity, such as race, ethnicity, indigeneity, religion, culture, language, neurodiversity, dis/ability, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.

Funding Details:

- Three award winners will share a total prize pool of \$150,000 CAD.
- Each winner will receive \$50,000 CAD.
- Award winners and honourable mention recipients will be invited to the award ceremony in late 2025.



- In-kind support and engagement for award winners and honourable mention recipients in 2026, including communications support, collaboration through events and global convenings, and opportunities for research and educational activities.

Title of the Call: Call for Applications: Creativity Pioneers Fund

Deadline: May 27th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Moleskine Foundation

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Non-profit organizations that are legally registered and operating in their countries.
- Organizations that place creativity at the centre of their mission and programs, demonstrating how they strengthen the role of creativity in social transformation.
- Organizations focusing on disadvantaged and/or marginalized communities, working primarily with youth (16-27 years old).
- The organization must be able to provide a bank account registered in its name.
- Organizations must not be affiliated with political parties, religious organizations, or involved in lobbying activities.
- Organizations must not have founders or representatives involved in events prejudicial to their reputation or legal status.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Creativity as a catalyst for positive social transformation.
- Social transformation of target communities through creativity.
- Focus on disadvantaged and/or marginalized communities, especially youth.

Funding Details:

- Unrestricted funding with a grant of 5,000 euros.
- The micro-grant supports essential functions and programs.
- Exceptions for organizations unable to receive donations from the EU and US due to political or regulatory restrictions will be evaluated case-by-case.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Legal persons
- Non-profit-making organizations
- Types of eligible organizations include non-governmental organizations, public sector operators, local authorities, international (inter-governmental) organizations as defined by Article 156 of the EU Financial Regulation



- Established in a Member State of the European Union, Republic of Moldova, or other eligible countries as stipulated in the NDICI-GE

Title of the Call: Grants available for preventing and combating GBV and Violence Against Children

Deadline: May 29th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: European Commission

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Legal entities (public or private bodies)
- Applicants must be established in an eligible country:
- EU Member States (including overseas countries and territories)
- Countries associated with the CERV Programme or in ongoing negotiations for association agreements.

For Priority 1:

- Lead applicants must be non-profit making.
- Project must be transnational.
- Application must involve at least two organizations from two different eligible countries.
- EU grant applied for must be between EUR 1,000,000 and EUR 2,500,000

For Priorities 2, 3, and 4:

- Lead applicants must be non-profit making.
- Project can be national or transnational.
- Application must involve at least two organizations.
- EU grant applied for must be between EUR 100,000 and EUR 1,000,000

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Preventing and combating all forms of gender-based violence against women and girls and domestic violence
- Preventing and combating all forms of violence against children, young people, and other groups at risk
- Supporting and protecting victims of violence, including children orphaned due to domestic crimes.
- Ensuring equal protection for victims of gender-based violence throughout the EU

Title of the Call: Apply for UNHCR Refugee-led Innovation Fund

Deadline: May 31st, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Organizations led by people with lived experience of forced displacement, such as refugees, asylum-seekers, the internally displaced, returnees, and stateless people.
- Applicants must apply as a team, usually as part of an existing organization.
- Both registered and unregistered organizations that are recognized within their communities due to their past significant contributions and initiatives
- Additional attention will be given to organizations led by LGBTIQ+ persons, women, people with disabilities, Indigenous populations, and other underrepresented groups.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Refugee-led innovation
- Reshaping the participation of displaced and stateless people in humanitarian work
- Testing and implementing ideas with strong community approaches

Funding Details:

- Organizations can apply for up to 45,000 USD in funding.
- Projects can commence as early as March 2025
- Support period of up to 18 months

Title of the Call: Call for Humanitarian Innovation Projects 2024

Deadline: May 31st, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs, France

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- International and local humanitarian NGOs
- Individual organizations or consortiums
- Only one project per organization or consortium

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Integrating the place of women and girls and gender issues in humanitarian action
- Addressing the consequences of climate change on humanitarian crises

Deadline: May 31st, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: World Association for Christian Communication (WACC)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Civil society organizations legally registered in DAC-list countries in Asia, the Caribbean, Central and Eastern Europe, Middle East, and North Africa (MENA) region, and Latin America
- Only one application per organization is considered.
- Organizations must have good standing and credibility.
- WACC does not accept project applications from individuals or government institutions.
- WACC supports organizations of all faiths and none.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Strengthening public voices and participation of marginalized, excluded, and dispossessed people and communities in communication
- Monitoring digital news media on:
 - Conflict, peace, and security reporting

- WACC will support up to five projects under this call.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

New Funding Opportunities for Academia

Title of the Call: Large Research Grants on Education Program

Deadline: May 22nd, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Spencer Foundation

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Principal Investigators (PIs) and Co-PIs must have an earned doctorate in an academic discipline or professional field or have appropriate experience in an education research-related profession.



- Graduate students may be part of the research team, but they cannot be named as the PI or Co-PI
- The PI must be affiliated with a non-profit organization or public/governmental institution willing to serve as the administering organization.
- Proposals must be submitted in English and budgets must be proposed in U.S. Dollars
- PIs and Co-PIs may only hold one active research grant from the Spencer Foundation at a time.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Education research projects that aim to study education
- Proposals from multiple disciplinary and methodological perspectives
- Development of foundational knowledge impacting educational discourse
- Relevant topics such as education, anthropology, philosophy, psychology, sociology, law, economics, history, or neuroscience

Funding Details:

- Total budget: between \$125,000 and \$500,000
- Funding tiers: \$125,000 to \$250,000; \$250,001 to \$375,000; \$375,001 to \$500,000
- Projects may not be longer than 5 years in duration.

Title of the Call: “Democracy and Diversity – Can we transcend the divides?” Initiatives

Deadline: May 17th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: World Forum for Democracy

Eligibility of Entities to Apply: Open to any public or private organization worldwide.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Elections and Value Divides: Addressing the impact of elections on societal divides and exploring inclusive electoral practices and ideas to overcome binary thinking in diverse societies.
- Unravelling the Web of Disinformation: Analysing the mechanics of disinformation campaigns, their impact on democracy, and strategies to counteract them.
- Citizen Engagement for Democratic Renewal: Assessing the role of civil society in civic engagement and exploring new forms of citizens’ engagement and decision-making.
- Additional Initiative Examples: Depolarizing elections, promoting unifying leadership, innovative policy-making methods, social media accountability, resilience against disinformation, anti-corruption efforts, empowering underrepresented groups, diverse approaches to opposition politics, media ownership diversity, AI in politics, education on disinformation, diversity management, and international partnerships for inclusive societies.

Title of the Call: Empower to Plan Small Grants Programme

Deadline: May 17th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Population Matters

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Must align with Population Matters' mission and vision, supporting human rights, women's empowerment, and global justice.
- Organizations must integrate two or more thematic areas specified under Empower to Plan.
- Applicants should be registered grassroots / non-profit/ NGO /trust / civil society / community-based organizations in their operational country.
- Annual income between £5,000 and £250,000. Preference for organizations at the lower end of this range.
- Must have an internationally registered bank account and legal capability to receive funds from an international organization.
- Ability to provide annual and/or management accounts, ideally audited, upon request.
- Implementation or willingness to implement safeguarding, financial management, and anti-fraud/bribery/corruption policies.
- Desirable: Community-governed or led organizations, particularly those with limited access to larger donor funding.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Collaboration with organizations enhancing lives of girls and women and protecting the environment.
- Projects incorporating sexual and reproductive health, gender justice, environmental justice, family planning, empowerment of youth/girls/women, environmental education, climate resilience/mitigation, and species/habitat conservation.
- Preference for projects adopting the Population/People, Health, and Environment (PHE) approach and those working with boys and men for gender equality.

Funding Details:

- Maximum grant per application: £7,000.
- Typical grant range: £4,000 to £6,000.
- Full grant amount provided at the funding period start.
- 3 grants awarded annually under this program.

Title of the Call: UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education

Deadline: May 24th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Government of the People's Republic of China, UNESCO



Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Nominations are accepted from Governments of UNESCO Member States and Non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in official partnership with UNESCO.
- Eligible entities can nominate up to three individuals, institutions, or organizations demonstrating strong, innovative contributions to girls' and women's education.
- Note that self-nominations are not permitted.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- The Prize is dedicated to honouring exceptional and innovative efforts by individuals, institutions, and organizations in advancing girls' and women's education.
- It emphasizes projects that effectively improve and enhance the educational opportunities for girls and women, consequently improving the quality of their lives.

Funding Details:

- Total Funding: The Prize is awarded annually to two laureates, each receiving an award of US \$50,000 to support their continued work in the field of girls' and women's education.

Title of the Call: New Fund for Strengthening the Economic and Social Empowerment of Women in Vulnerable Situations

Deadline: May 31st, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: International Organization of Francophonie

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Civil society organizations (CSOs) such as NGOs, foundations, humanitarian associations, economic interest groups, cooperatives, private research institutes, and partners.
- Must be registered and recognized by the authorities of one of the 54 full member states of the OIF for more than two years.
- Demonstrated functional, transparent, and democratic governance.
- Annual financial capacities equal to or greater than the requested grant amount.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Economic and social empowerment of women in vulnerable situations.
- Priority themes vary by region, focusing on women's inclusion in economic and social life, access to professional training, and development of income-generating activities.
- Particular attention to projects targeting employability and entrepreneurship of women.

Funding Details:

- Grants between 15,000 and 100,000 euros, not exceeding 80% of the total project cost.
- Grant paid in two installments: 80% upon signing, 20% upon submission of required documents.
- Operating costs limited to 20% of the total project cost.
- Budget allocation for visibility actions (5%-7%) and monitoring and evaluation (15%-20%).



- The Fund's Management Committee may adjust projects and grant amounts.

Title of the Call: TIAW – World of Difference Awards 2024

Deadline: June 28th, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: The International Alliance for Women (TIAW)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Individual nominees: Women or Men from any sector.
- Organizational nominees: Include community groups, corporate entities, educational institutions, entrepreneurial ventures, non-profits/NGOs, public service/government bodies, and corporate organizations (excluding non-profits/NGOs).
- Special category for Young Leaders under the age of 25.
- Note: Self-nominations are not accepted.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Award categories span various sectors including community, corporate, education, entrepreneurship, non-profit/NGO, public service/government, young leaders, and corporate organizations.

- Awards recognize individual and organizational achievements without specified funding.

Title of the Call: Dutch Jewish Humanitarian Fund to Enhance Jewish Life in Central and Eastern Europe

Deadline: July 1st, 2024

Funding Source/Donor: Dutch Jewish Humanitarian Fund (JHF)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Must be a registered organization outside the Netherlands, not connected to the Dutch-Jewish community in Israel, and without activities in the Netherlands.
- Organizations primarily focused on granting funds, public or semi-public institutions, and those with capital infrastructure, for-profit projects, graveyard restorations, or material support for Holocaust survivors are not eligible.
- Preference for local organizations in Central and Eastern Europe, with a focus on private institutions or organizations.

Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:

- Supporting Jewish communities in areas like culture, education, and promoting mutual respect.
- Projects should target young people and focus on leadership training.
