
#### THE REGION TODAY

The region remains vulnerable to armed conflict, political and socio-economic instability, and climate induced disasters creating new waves of displacement and exacerbating existing humanitarian needs. UNHCR is responding to four situations -Sudan, South Sudan, Somalia and Burundi - and is also affected by the DRC Situation. At the regional level, UNHCR works with Regional Economic Communities. UN sister agencies. NGOs and others to support protection and solutions with and for refugees and internally displaced persons (IDPs).

UNHCR continues to work with development partners to mainstream forcibly displaced populations into development planning and sustainable responses, promoting inclusion and solutions from the start. New partnerships with the private sector and progress on the localization agenda contribute to sustainable responses, which are anchored in efforts to enhance the resilience and self-reliance of displaced populations and their hosts.

Resettlement and Complementary Pathways needs remain equally significant. Onward movement of refugees from their first countries of asylum requires a regionally harmonized approach. A route-based approach will be applied in response to mixed movements of refugees and migrants, promoting more humane and effective responses, and delivering better outcomes for people on the move, as well as affected communities and States.

Over the next three years, UNHCR will consolidate and enhance its efforts to provide protection, assistance and solutions for and with forcibly displaced and stateless populations, and promote improved responses to forced displacement in the region, in line with the priorities of Member States and RECs, and in collaboration with a wide and diverse range of stakeholders.




**KEY POPULATION STATISTICS** 

**18M** Internally Displaced Persons



### NEEDS-BASED REQUIREMENTS (2025) BY BUDGETARY POPULATION GROUPS (Million USD)\*




## NEEDS-BASED REQUIREMENTS (2025) BY GLOBAL IMPACT AREA (%)

UNHCR'S work is guided by five strategic priorities:






**Diversified Resource Mobilization and Transformative Partnerships** with public and private stakeholders to mobilise and leverage financing, influence, and expertise in support of sustainable approaches to protection and solutions.

**Evidence-Based Advocacy and Data-Informed Action** will advance the rights, inclusion, and development opportunities of forcibly displaced and stateless persons through evidence-driven advocacy and communications, and the systematic provision of critical, comprehensive, and coherent data to inform efficient programming, policy, and decision-making.

Strengthened People Management and Workforce Planning will enhance the delivery of its protection and solutions mandate through strategic human resources support to operations and managers, focused on effective workforce planning, talent management, and strengthened people leadership across the region.

**Efficiency and Sustainable Responses** will improve performance by using data to identify and implement efficient business processes across operations. This will help streamline workflows, avoid duplication and parallel systems, optimize resources, and strengthen impact delivery by UNHCR and partners.
