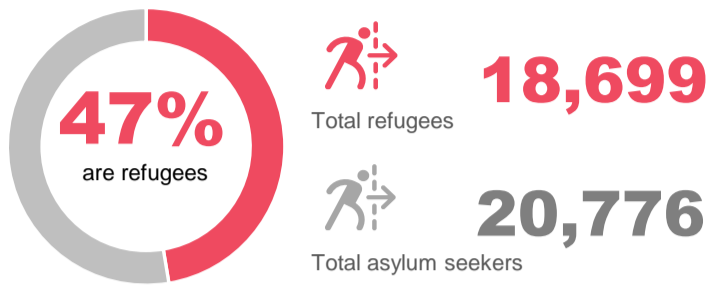

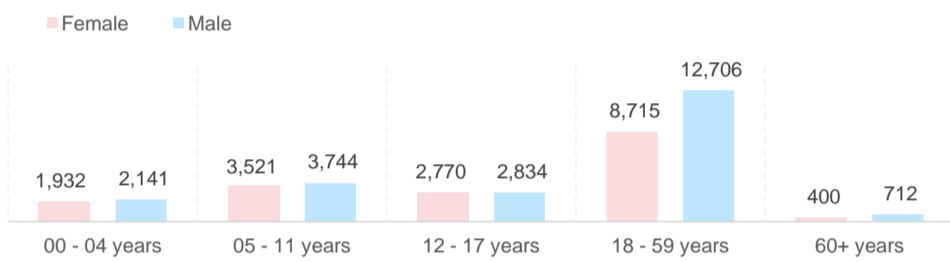
Total refugees and asylum seekers in Somalia



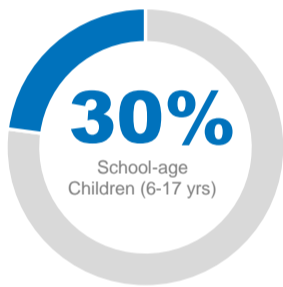
As of 30 June 2024, Somalia is hosting 39,475 refugees and asylum-seekers, among which 66% are women and children. The majority of refugees and asylum-seekers 65% are from Ethiopia, followed by Yemen 30%, Syria 4% and other countries 1%.

74% refugees and asylum-seekers reside in urban or peri-urban settings across Woqooyi Galbeed and Bari regions, in the northern part of the country.

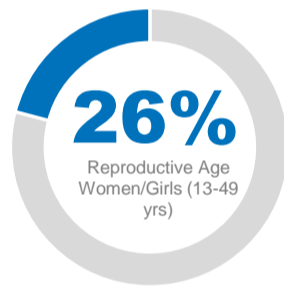

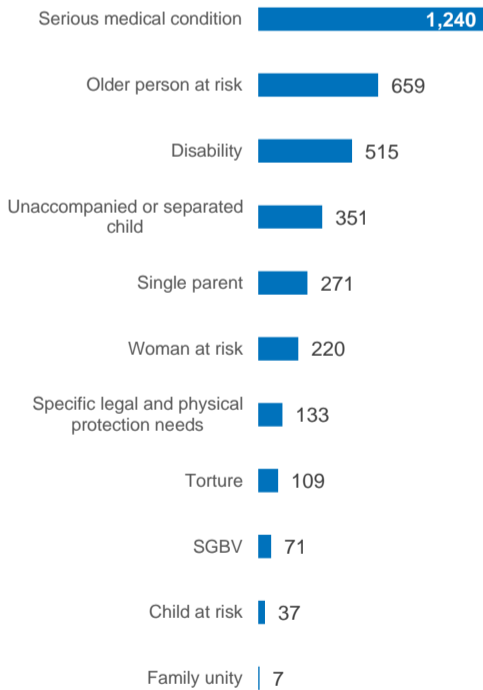
### School-age Children



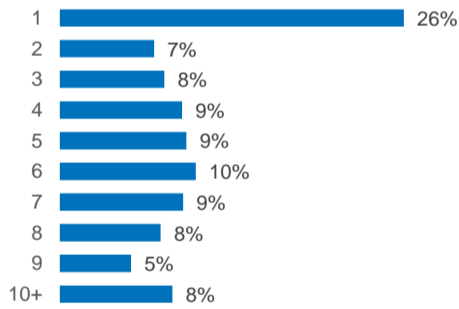

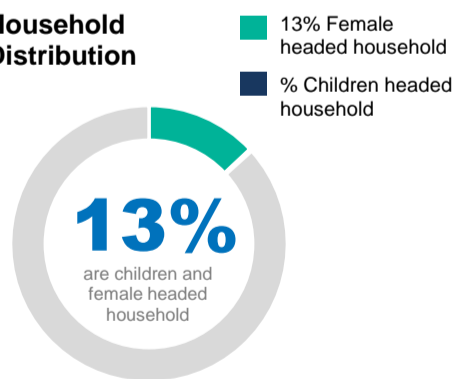

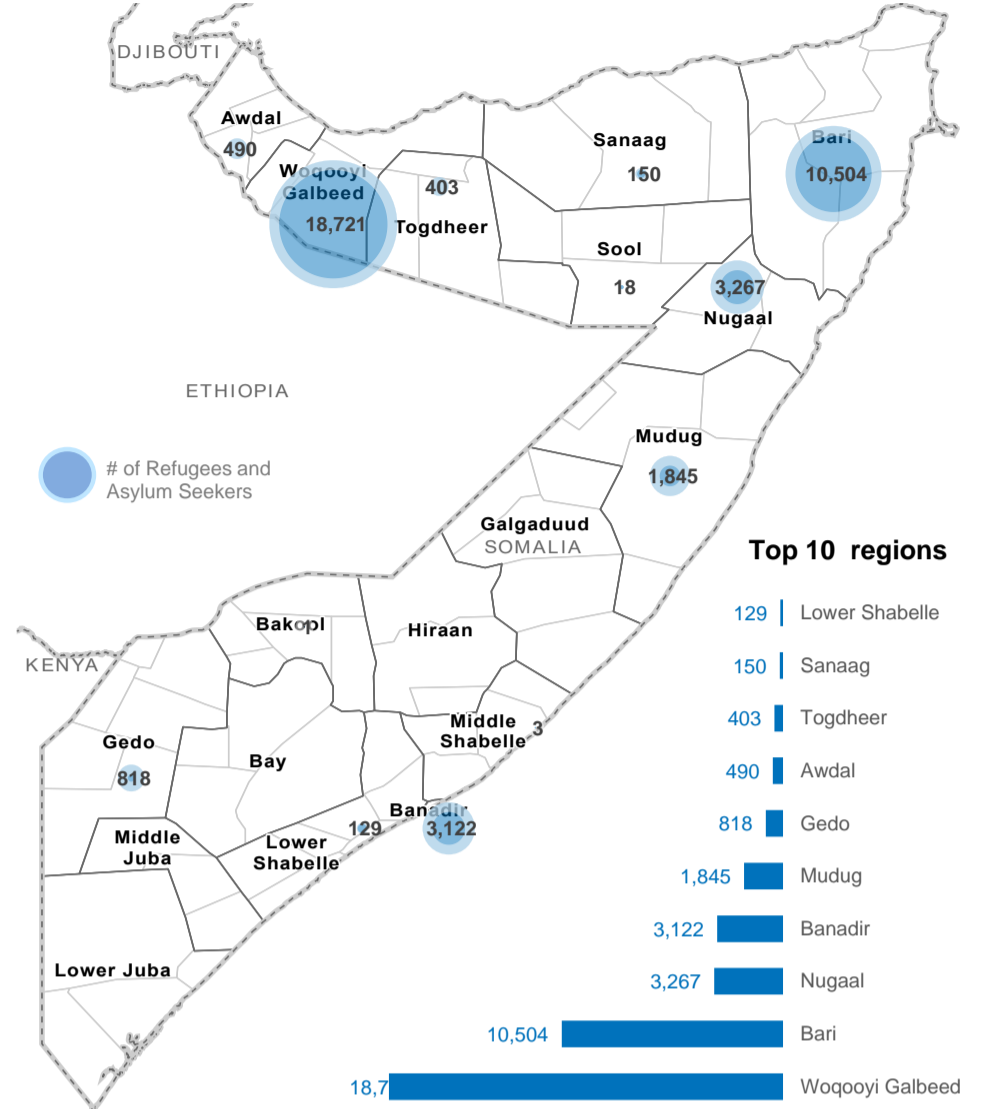

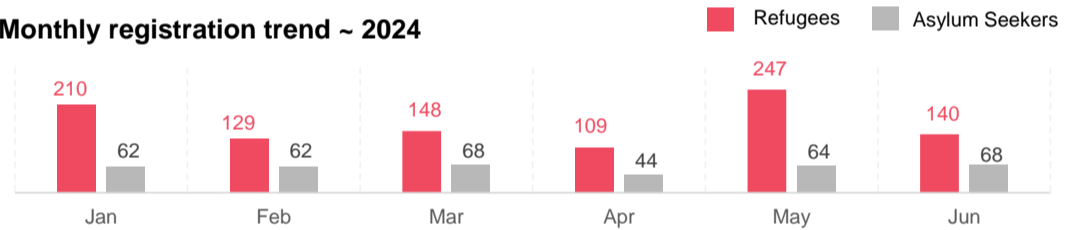

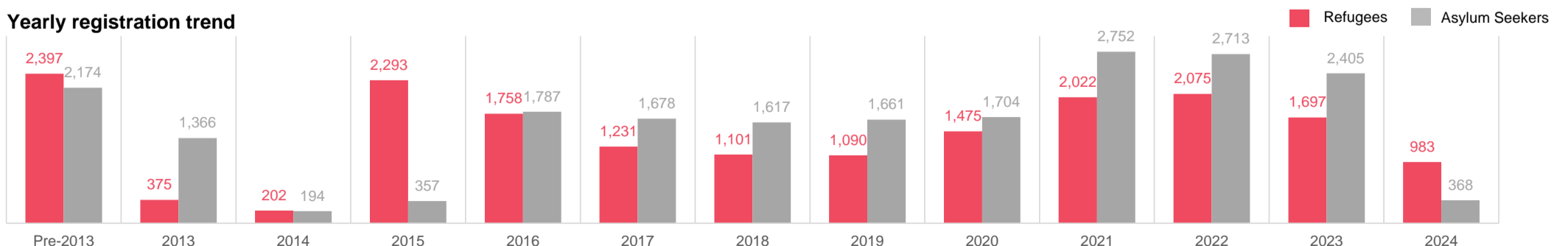
### Monthly registration trend ~ 2024
