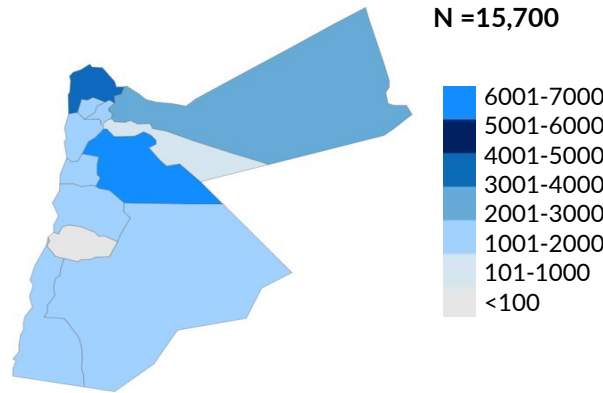


15,700 refugees with work experience, training and self-reported experience in the ICT sector:

Around **10,700** refugees self-reported experience in e-commerce and **6,600** self-reported graphic design
992* refugees with work experience in the ICT sector
431 have work experience in Jordan, of which **94%** are male, **90%** are located in Amman, Irbid, Mafraq and Zarqa and **53%** reported working in the last 12 months

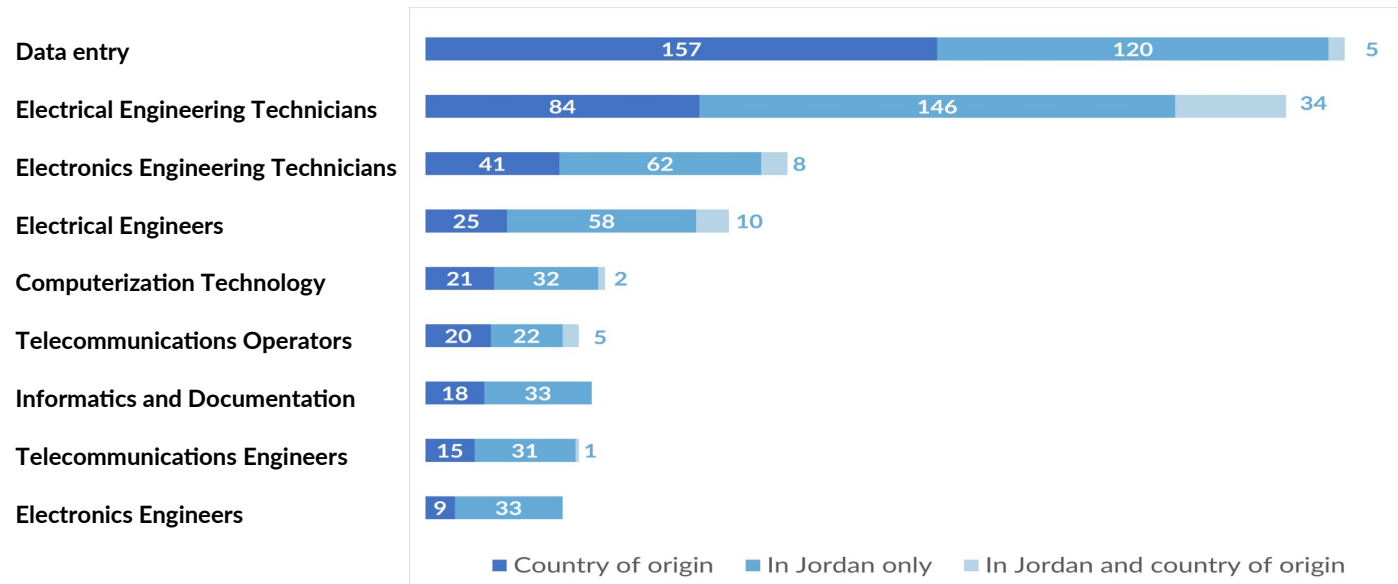


Distribution of individuals with work experience, training and self-reported experience in ICT.

412 refugees were trained in Jordan



745 refugees have a tertiary education related to ICT

190 refugees have a vocational background in ICT

70 students currently enrolled in tertiary education studying ICT



Of those with ICT work experience, the following self-report some level of English language skills:

80% some level of speaking

73% some level of reading

78% some level of writing



92% are willing to commute to work; **64%** are willing to be relocated for job opportunities, including changing governorates. This is reflected by 30% of those with work experience in ICT being above 45 years old.

*All presented data is restricted to individuals willing to work; ** Reported work experience in Jordan refers to current employment and work experience in country of origin (based on those willing to work).
 Note: ICT professions = electrical/electronics/telecommunication engineers and engineering technicians, broadcasting, transmission and telecommunications equipment operators, informatics and documentation, professionals, computerization, statistics and communication technology professionals. This is based on a 88% response rate of registered refugees in contact with the UNHCR in the last 18 months.
