Introduction and welcoming

CCCM Cluster opened the meeting by welcoming attendees and introducing new members, including Mustafa Al Mamou, in his new capacity, position, as National CCCM Cluster Co Coordinator.

Updates on the First Allocation of the Yemen Humanitarian Fund

Following successive consultation sessions arranged by OCHA at hub levels, the standard allocation, 30 million dollars, has been distributed across Yemen based on RCTs recommendations at each hub.

The focus has been on addressing needs related to seasonal priorities, including floods malnutrition, protracted displacement.

Key CCCM areas of intervention include site coordination, monitoring, and site maintenance and improvement. CCCM Cluster emphasized the importance of conducting needs assessments and aligning projects with the allocation strategy. Cluster also highlighted the need for strong problem statements and consider the CCCM Transitioning Strategy for 2025. CCCM cluster encouraged partners to reach out with any questions or challenges they may face in the proposal development phase.

Site Improvement Activity, IOM

IOM presented a project focused on site improvements, aimed at improving education facilities in Al-Khokhah area on the west coast.

The project addressed the lack of access to education for IDPs children and aimed to improve the infrastructure of existing schools to accommodate more students. Interventions included building new classrooms, rehabilitating existing ones, providing solar power systems, and enhancing sanitation facilities.

Site Improvement project also focused on promoting social cohesion by involving both displaced and host communities in the planning and implementation process.

Meeting attendees acknowledged the importance of engaging with the education cluster and education offices, which will ensure sustainability of the project after handover to the local education authorities.

Updates and Challenges

CCCM Cluster updated on the Humanitarian Program Cycle for 2025, noting that consultations with stakeholders are underway to identify priorities, and stressed on the importances of participating on these consultations, taking place at hub level.

CCCM cluster discussed the development of the cluster transitioning strategy for 2025, which will focus on an area-based approach. A working group has been formed to define the concept of "area" and develop guidelines for requirements and resources.

Meeting attendees discussed the challenges of funding allocation to CCCM and the need to advocate for the CCCM sector as a life-saving activity.

DRC gave an update on the new displacement took place in Al-Musaimir and response done. They brought the issue of conflicting displacement figures between RRM and other service providers, which may cause a neglecting for some IDPs. DRC requested cluster support to request RRM to share the data for monitoring and coordination purposes.

DRC updated the cluster members of the handover of 5 sites from DRC to NMO in Lahj governorate, are Alhamra Site, Alamal Site, Almekhshaba Site, Sad Falig Site, and Um Huraiz Site Effective from as 1st of October.

AoB

Haider Al-Shadani Head of MoPIC highlighted the importance of collaboration between the cluster and the ministry. He emphasized the ministry's role in facilitating coordination and providing support to partners in the governorates. He encouraged partners to reach out to the ministry for any assistance needed and expressed his commitment to facilitating their work.

CCCM cluster thanked MoPIC for their contributions and highlighted the importance of continued collaboration and communication.
