New Funding Opportunities

Title of the Call: Minorities Fellowship Programme 2024

Deadline: Nov 22nd, 2024

Funding Source: Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to human rights defenders from national, ethnic, religious, or linguistic minority groups.
- Candidates must self-identify and be recognized by their community as members of a minority group.
- Candidates should be proposed and supported by a community organization that works on minority issues.
- Applicants should have proficiency in English, Russian, or Arabic and be committed to training others in their communities upon program completion.
- Candidates must be at least 18 years old and not immediate family members of UN staff.

Funding Details:

- A round-trip economy ticket to Geneva.
- Basic health insurance for the program's duration.
- A stipend to cover modest accommodation and living expenses.

Thematic Focus: The OHCHR Minorities Fellowship Programme is a training initiative designed to empower human rights defenders from national, ethnic, religious, and linguistic minority communities. It aims to enhance participants' understanding of the United Nations system, international human rights instruments, and mechanisms pertinent to minority issues, thereby equipping them to effectively advocate for and protect minority rights within their communities.

- Host Organizations: Must be a registered charitable organization capable of providing mentorship, logistical support, and grant fund management for the Young Leader's project.

- Preference for: INGOs, umbrella organizations, and consortia of NGOs with expertise in democracy, human rights, rule of law advocacy, policymaking, or experience with the Council of Europe's standards
- Additional priority for projects involving: Women's rights, youth engagement, and support for vulnerable groups; events spanning multiple European regions

Title of the Call: International Trans Fund Grant Program – Seed (\$10K-\$25K) or Thrive Funding (\$25K-\$50K)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Trans-led groups with trans individuals in decision-making roles, making up at least 75% of staff, board members, or other decision-makers.

- Not eligible: individuals, groups with budgets above \$100,000, or those focused solely on direct services without movement-building contributions.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Principal Investigators (PIs) must hold a doctorate and be affiliated with a non-profit or public institution willing to administer the grant. Graduate students may participate but cannot be PIs or Co-PIs.
- Eligible organizations include non-profit or public universities, school districts, research facilities, and other non-profits with 501(c)(3) status or equivalent outside the U.S.
- Proposals are open globally but must be in English and budgeted in U.S. Dollars.

- Eligible entities include public bodies, international organizations, affiliated entities, and associated partners as per specific call conditions.

Thematic Focus:

- Combating hate speech and hate crime, both online and offline.
- Reinforcing hate crime training and capacity building for police and other relevant security practitioners.
- Enhancing tools and methods for lawful detection, reporting, and analysis of hate speech-related activities.

Title of the Call: Recognizing Institutional and Organizational Capacity for Effective Workforce Development Programs

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Not-for-profit organizations registered with their relevant official national and/or local government bodies.
- Entries and supporting documentation, including financials, must be submitted in English and in USD or GBP.
- Organizations may submit only one entry per prize year. Previous prize winners are ineligible for the next three years.
- The project/program must be up and running before March 1st, 2024, and operational for at least six months.

- A candidate may be a person or an organization.

- Two or more candidates may share the prize.

Title of the Call: Horizon Europe's Design for Adaptability, Re-use and Deconstruction of Buildings Programme

Deadline: Feb 4th, 2025

Funding Source: European Commission (EC)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Legal entities established in EU Member States, Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs), countries associated with Horizon Europe, and eligible low- and middle-income countries. International European research organizations are also eligible.

Thematic Focus:

- Integrate innovative tools, products, and techniques for construction and renovation that extend the service life of buildings.
- Validate solutions that facilitate deconstruction, reuse, and adaptability of buildings.
- Develop materials and products that can be disassembled and reused, including CO2-storing bio-based materials.
- Address components of buildings including structural elements, envelopes, and technical systems.
- Ensure solutions are rooted in local/regional value chains and adaptable to local sourcing of materials.
- Address climate change mitigation and minimize negative impacts on pollution and biodiversity.

- The check for funding is required for coordinators if the requested grant amount is EUR 500,000 or more.
- Public bodies or international organizations are exempt from this check for grants under EUR 60,000.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Nominees must be established, nongovernmental, publicly supported charitable organizations.
- Nominees must have U.S. IRS tax-exempt status or equivalent for international organizations.
- Legally established for at least five years.
- Own audited financial statements for at least five consecutive years
- Expenditures greater than \$750,000 in the most recent audited fiscal year
- Cannot be a Hilton Humanitarian Prize Laureate or a local office/member organization of a Prize Laureate
- Cannot be local offices/member organizations of parent organizations or fiscally sponsored organizations.
- Cannot be specific programs within organizations or university-based projects.
- Cannot be academic institutions providing educational degrees but can be affiliates with independent tax-exempt status and audited financials.

- Education: Initiatives aimed at increasing access to quality education for all
- Economic Empowerment: Programs that support economic self-sufficiency and poverty alleviation.

- Emergency Response: Initiatives providing disaster relief and humanitarian aid in crisis situations.

Ongoing Opportunities Without a Deadline

Title of the Call: Aurora Prize for Awakening Humanity 2025

Deadline: Ongoing Opportunity

Funding Source: Aurora Humanitarian Initiative Charitable Foundation

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Individuals or organizations.
- Self-nominations are not allowed, and anonymous nominations are not accepted.
- Nominators must provide full contact details and submit a letter of authorization if nominating on behalf of an organization.
