

Complementary Pathways are safe and regulated opportunities for refugees to travel to a third country where their international protection needs are met. These pathways allow refugees to travel from their country of asylum to a third country that grants them residence, leading to a more permanent solution in most cases.



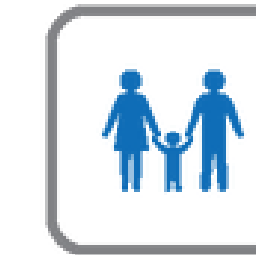

Outreach

UNHCR works closely with partners and communities to ensure that refugees are aware of and are empowered to access different pathways available to them. Outreach also provides information to help communities stay safe from fraud and exploitation schemes.

So far in 2024, UNHCR reached over **2,473** refugees through the following activities:

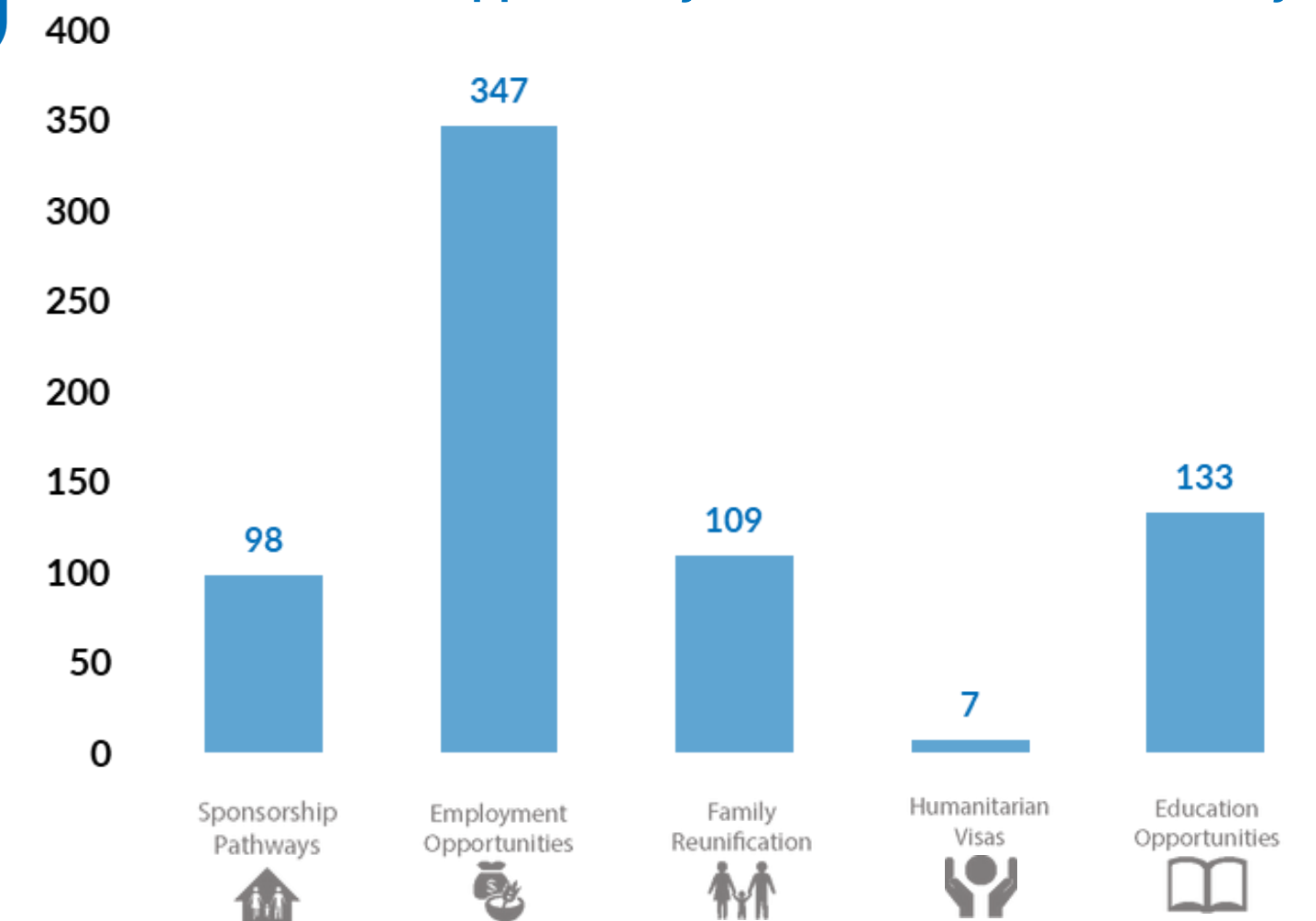


Assistance

While refugees can often access pathways independently, some may face legal, administrative, and practical barriers. UNHCR and its partners provide counseling, referral, support for upskilling or certification programs, legal assistance, departure facilitation, and other services to refugees.

Over **694** refugees have been assisted to access different pathways in 2024.

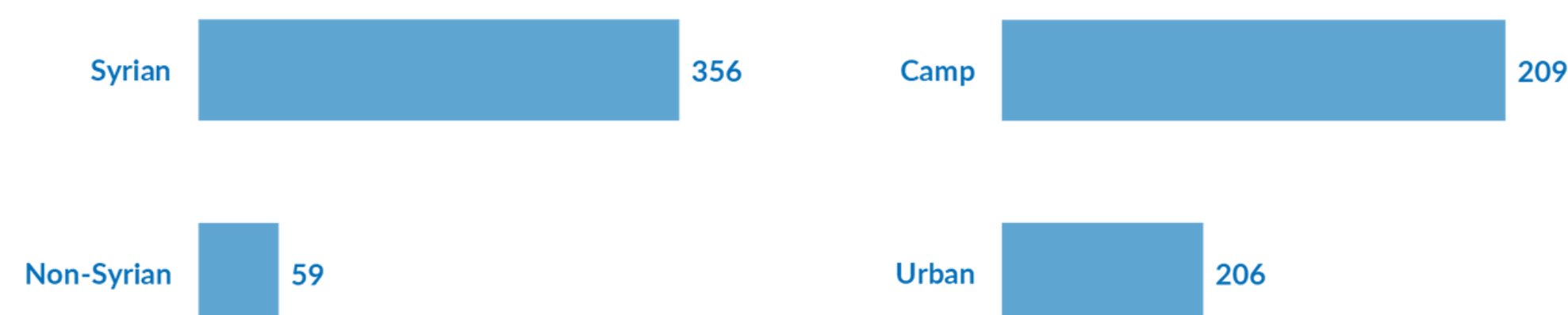
of Individuals Supported by UNHCR to Access Pathways



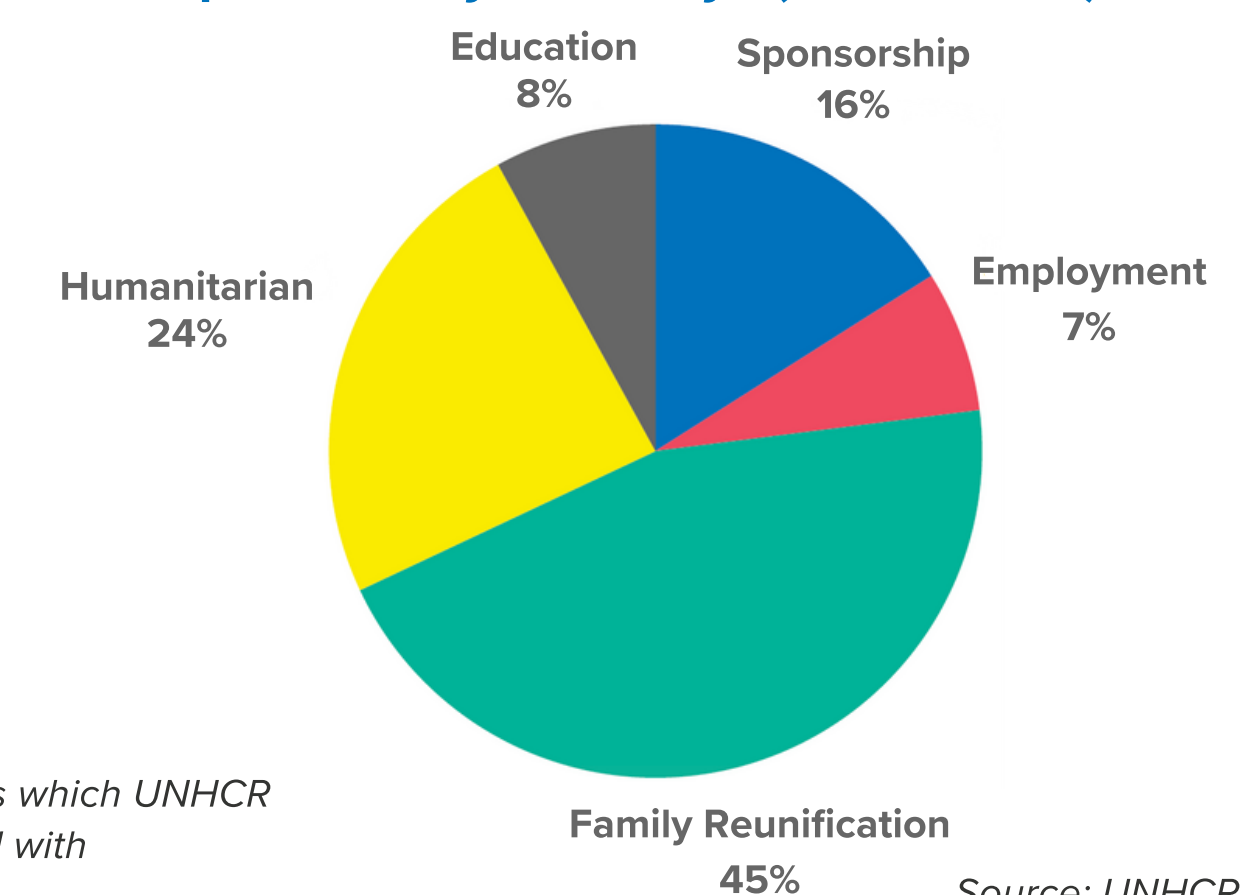
Departures

As refugees can often leave Jordan on pathways without UNHCR support, UNHCR cannot capture the total number of departures. Aggregated data from various partners indicate that over **8,000** refugees have successfully left Jordan on pathways since 2020.
