Situation Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Since the last meeting (during January 2024) the population has decreased in Romania: 77. 216 refugees. - Number of Temporary protection documents increased up to 153,703. - New boarding monitoring form was deployed for better understanding of the reasons which make refugees leave Romania. Assessment registry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Considering that each partner working with this population category invests significant resources, including time, manpower, and finances, into collecting information, there is a proposal to enhance the effectiveness of data utilization by consolidating efforts. The suggestion is to collaborate in the collection and utilization of data, maximizing the efficiency, avoiding the data-duplication and impact of the information gathered. - In order to do that, CSCM together with UNHCR are developing the new tool, which will be shared with all partners in a short time.
