Protection & Gender Mainstreaming:

Protection mainstreaming is a key priority for the LRP 2024/2025 across all sectors. Sector coordinators hold responsibility for protection mainstreaming and inclusion into the work plan to ensure all sector activities apply protection standards, including Do No Harm. Sector coordinators are therefore requested to develop the work plan and to facilitate the following process for the protection mainstreaming areas, including gender, age and disability as well as AAP. **To foster the mainstreaming of disability, gender and GBV as well as to ensure enhanced data disaggregation, sectors are asked to:**

1) Review indicators and disaggregation currently included in the LRP 2025 sectoral log frame:

•Identify gaps in data and reporting/disaggregation.

•Use the Gender and GBV Risk Mitigation Action Plans developed by the sector's Gender and GBV focal points. If you have any questions, please contact Simona Pari at simona.pari@undp.org.

•Hold consultations and discussions with sector members to agree on a minimum-standard of disaggregation going forward; either through a mid-year review in 2025. Please include a discussion on whether having a focal point system by the sector would work best (similar to Gender and GBV) or if you have other suggestions.

2) Review accessibility of services & meaningful participation of People with Disabilities (PwD) in all stages of program cycles, including community consultations: • Present results through ISCG in 2025.

• Provide the community/affected people with feedback on the results and achievements concerning disaggregation and the reach of PwD.
