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Transit Center two (TC2), also known as the extension Site, was opened in January 2, 2024 to ease congestion in Transit Center one (TC1) in Renk. The transit center, with a capacity of 2,695 individuals, is now accommodating 9,401 refugees and returnees, which is 349% of its intended capacity and the population continued to grow. In addition, Acted completed 3 communal shelters in the site and were allocated to vulnerable families.

While most services are relatively consolidated, however mainly linked with the protracted situation of the site, associated protection risks are noted due to the overcrowded tap stands, insufficient lighting in WASH facilities (showers, latrines), limited food assistance and lack of dignified spaces/overcrowded shelters for both men and women. Concurrently, the nutrition overall situation is judged to deteriorate.

**Existing Gaps**

- **Safety & Security:** while it has been noticed an increase in shelters with internal lighting, most latrines and showers are completely dark.(08) newly
- **Hazard:** The risk of fire is imminent as dry season started with densely packed, flammable shelters and the absence of fire breaks/extinguishers, however, fire warden were trained, assembly point mapped and safety unit and CCCM installed 4 signposts with two indicating assembly points while others two contained messages of what to do in an event of fire outbreak. In addition, the CCCM process of procuring local fire-extinguishers were affected by recent USAID freezing while the awareness raising on fire safety and measures continue.
- **Health:** The two centers have two ambulances that cater for a population of roughly 15,000 refugees and returnees with an average of one ambulance serving approximately 7,500 individuals which meet a minimum standard.
- **Accessibility:** There has been an improvement within internal accessibility however there are still gaps requiring attention.
- **Disability Inclusion:** There is a limited availability of mobility aids and equipment for people with disabilities.
