The incentive-based volunteer scheme (IBV) aimed at providing refugees living in Azraq Refugee Camp with basic means to enhance their resilience and self-reliance due to the lack of livelihood means in the camp. The Incentive- Based Volunteering Scheme (IBV) has been a key aspect of refugee participation in the delivery of humanitarian assistance and other services in the camp. The factsheet contains information shared by the different humanitarian actors engaged in the IBV scheme.

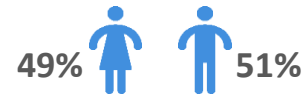

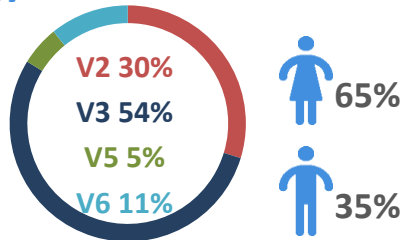

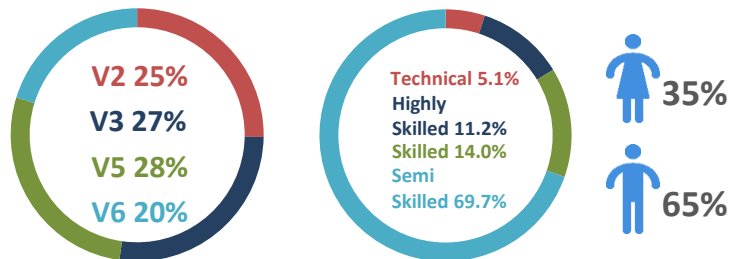
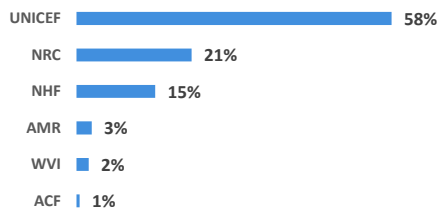

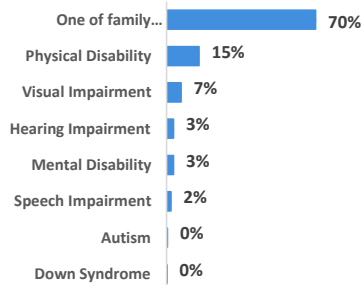
1,418 Total number of beneficiaries currently engaged with IBV program



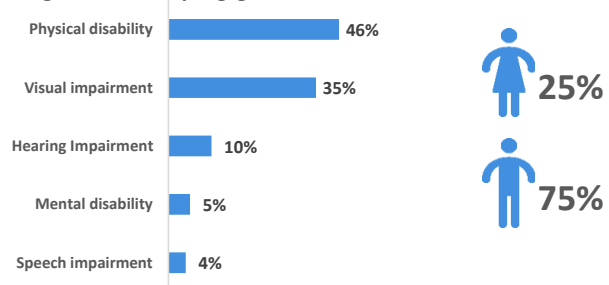
178 Total number of IBV positions rotated during February representing **13%** of total engaged with IBV

Feedback by community members:

- Community members stated that it takes a long time for applicants to engage in IBV opportunities. They asked to increase number of IBV opportunities across the camp.
- Some Community members stated that they never had the chance to engage in IBV opportunities before.
- Community members requested to rotate IBV opportunities more frequently specially for long ones.
