	The closure of the RAC #5 (UTA Gagauzia, Congaz, str. Lenin 72) which accommodates 85 people (18	
	HH), mostly are large Roma families, is ongoing to be completed officially by April 30.	
	 Most beneficiaries showed interest in the rental assistance programme. Challenges were identified 	
	with finding alternative accommodation, especially for Roma families and in rural areas, including	
	issues related to discrimination.	
	 Some families have been allowed to stay until the end of the school year to avoid disrupting the 	
	school year.	
	 Currently, 25 RACs remain open, with eight more planned to close by the end of 2025. 	
	 List of remaining RACs to be closed is available, and can be shared bilaterally. 	
	 Efforts are in place to close RACs during summer to consider both weather and the school year

	 Representative of WLO Biaz Gul asked for information about the Cash for Rent programme to allow 	
	the organization to help Roma families prepare all the documents, as most of them cannot read and	
	write. Biaz Gul also requested information on the criteria for the Cash for Rent programme.	
	According to UNHCR any household can express interest in the programme. All relocated households	
	are supported with case management by a Relocation Case Manager (RCM).

	 Alignment of project aims with EU strategic GBV priorities increases chances. 	for the upcoming workshop
	Identifying the eligibility criteria for EU grants:	on applying for grants.
	 The eligibility criteria associated with EU funding mechanisms must be thoroughly reviewed and 	
	clear to the applicant.	
	 Eligible applicants usually include NGOs, public sector institutions, and academic bodies. 	
	 Grants can target different priority areas, including experience in GBV prevention and response, 	
	cross-border cooperation, and engagement with vulnerable groups.	
	 It is essential that each call for proposals be read and examined carefully, with attention paid to the 	
	priorities and compliance criteria defined by the donors.	
	Researching available EU grants for GBV:	
	 A compilation of relevant funding platforms is underway by UNHCR. 	
	 The EU's official portal has a database for funding opportunities. 	
	 UNHCR is also gathering information on websites that offer online courses and trainings related to grant applications. 	
	 The Refugee Coordination Forum also shares funding opportunities for CSOs in Moldova. 	
	Building a strong proposal for EU grants:	
	 Proposals must be clearly articulated, with objectives, methodology, target populations, and expected outcomes. 	
	 An understanding of the problem and how the proposal will address them must be demonstrated. 	
	 Innovative approaches and solutions based on best practices are prioritized and call the attention of 	
	donors.	
	 A detailed and transparent budget, with all projected expenditures explicitly justified, shows 	
	accountability and helps build trust, reinforcing the NGOs financial organization.	

	 Measurable indicators show the project's potential impact and sustainability.
Nav	vigating the application process:
	 Applications can be complex, time consuming, requiring attention to detail.
	 Allocate time to get familiar with the application process, the call and guidelines. Understand
	submission formats (online etc.), consider details related to issues with the system, and take time
	to gather all required documentation (letters of support etc.)
	 Review final submission for accuracy and to identify gaps.
	• A clear workplan with roles, responsibilities and deadlines should be in place. It significantly helps
	the organization of the work.
	 Having a multi-functional team is useful to organize the process.
	 Emphasis on Strategic Partnerships, Compliance, and Sustainability
Part	tnerships and collaborations for applications:
	 Partnerships enhance credibility and changes for a successful application.
	 These should be strategic, with organizations that bring complementarity, expertise and resources,
	making the proposal more attractive.
	 Grassroots partnerships can increase access to targeted communities.
	 Community support increases accountability and chances of success.
Con	npliance and reporting:
	 Accurate financial records should be kept, with project progress tracked against established
	indicators, and regular reports submitted outlining activities and outcomes. Compliance not only
	ensures continued funding but also builds trust with funders and stakeholders.
	 The NGO should establish clear internal processes for monitoring activities and finances.
	 A Project Manager can support these activities and ensure accountability.
	 Indicator targets should be carefully defined and monitored.
-	pact and sustainability:
	 Sustainability strategies should be integrated from the beginning, including capacity building through
	training and local stakeholder partnerships.
	 Project outcomes must be evaluated to understand what works and what does not work and adjusted
	through regular assessments.
	 Sharing success stories enhances transparency and help attract future funding by demonstrating the
	organization's effectiveness and impact to address GBV.



	Questions/comments related to the grant's application:	
	 Casey O'Neill (CWS) inquired about the relevance of prioritizing project outcomes and long-term 	
	impact, rather than relying solely on quantitative indicators (e.g., number of individuals reached).	
	Additionally, Casey asked whether resources are available to assist organizations in measuring	
	outcomes such as behavioral change and other qualitative dimensions of impact.	
	° It was noted that, in some instances, indicators may need to be reformulated following	
	discussions with stakeholders, particularly in the context of EU-funded projects, which often	
	emphasize broader impact and alignment with overarching strategic goals.	
	 Sustainability was highlighted by UNHCR as a key concern for donors. To ensure that project impact 	
	is maintained beyond the funding period, creative strategies were proposed, including:	
	 Enabling beneficiaries to advocate for support with local authorities 	
	 Facilitating the formation of community support groups 	
	 Empowering participants to serve as ongoing community actors 	
	° The importance of equipping individuals with the knowledge, tools, and confidence to	
	sustain project outcomes independently was strongly emphasized.
