





Amidst a worsening protection crisis, heightened political polarization, and the imminent threat of further economic hardship and sanctions following the 10 of January presidential inauguration, funding shortfalls have compelled UNHCR Venezuela to implement operational and personnel reductions. These cuts will diminish the scope of its activities within the country, beginning with the closure of the Field Unit in Santa Elena de Uairén, located in the southeastern state of Bolívar on the Brazilian border. Despite the challenging economic and political climate, significant numbers of Venezuelans have continued to spontaneously return to their country. Population movements monitored by UNHCR along the Colombian border during the first half of the year have consistently shown weekly majorities of returns over departures. This trend is largely attributed to the closure of the US border and the resumption of repatriation and deportation flights from host countries. To address the evolving situation, UNHCR has been strengthening its partnerships with other UN agencies, NGOs, implementing partners, relevant institutions, and the private sector to support humanitarian-development-peace nexus efforts to strengthen community resilience and enable the sustainable reintegration of returnees, the key components of UNHCR's strategy to break the cycle of displacement in Venezuela.
