

Context

From April to August 2025, UNHCR Sub-office of Mopti witnessed a steady influx of refugees from the villages of Burkina Faso. These people fled following attacks and the reinforced presence of armed groups on the outskirts of their localities. Some 22,700 individuals arrived between April and July 2025, while more than 14,500 joined them from 5ht of August 2025. UNHCR is working alongside the authorities and the humanitarian community to mobilize a joint and coordinated emergency response which will require additional resources to meet the urgent needs of the refugees and reduce the pressure on generous host communities and fragile public services.

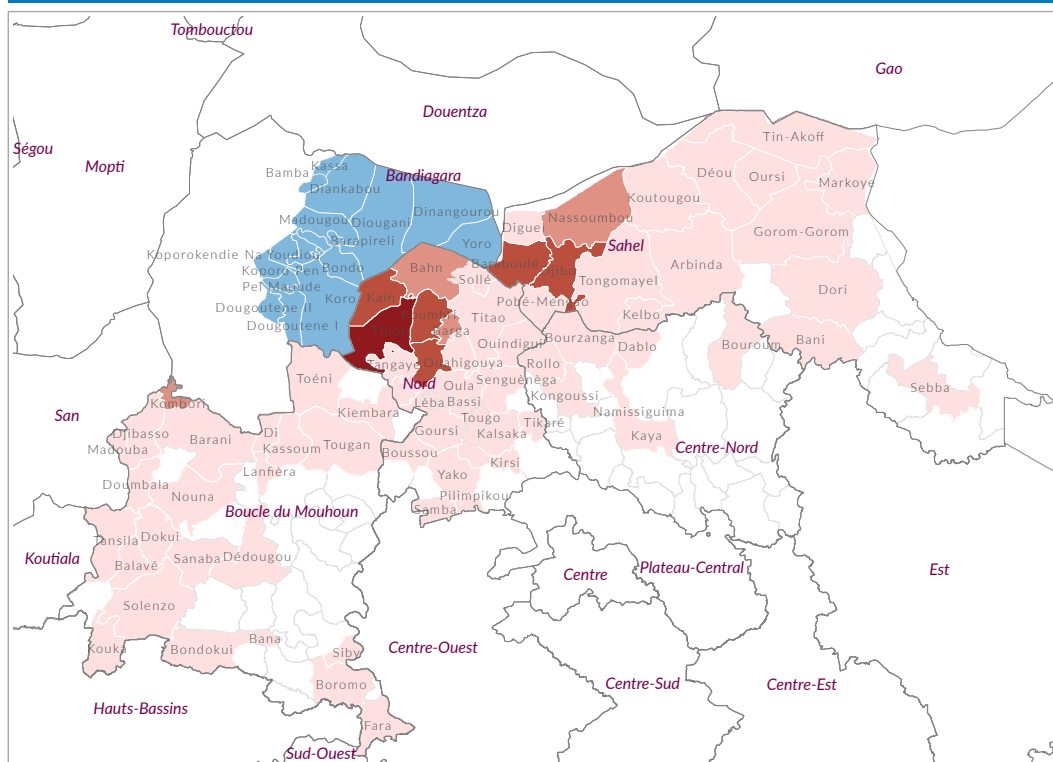

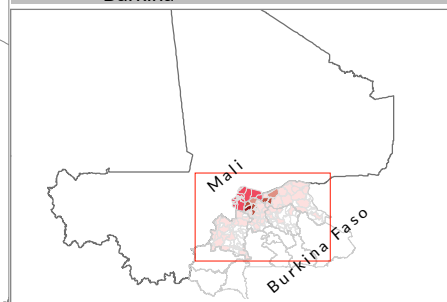

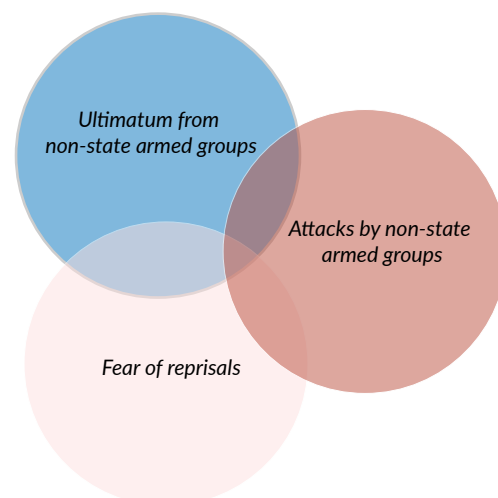
