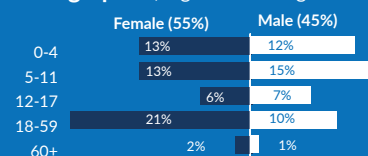

UNHCR declared Level 2 Emergency in May 2025. Since then UNHCR, RRS and Partners have been responding to the emergency providing lifesaving assistance including Protection, Shelter, Food & Nutrition, Health and WASH.

Registration and relocation to Luakdong refugee site began on 22 July 2025. Hence some activities began as of that date.
