

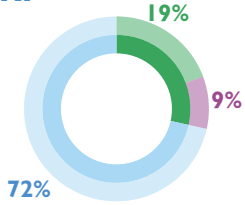
Lebanon Protection Sector: At a Glance

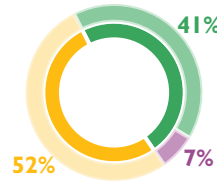

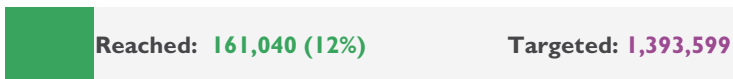

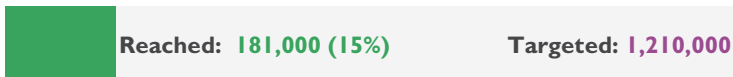
