

Yusuf Batil Camp is located in Guffa Payam, Maban County, Upper Nile State





### Highlights

UNHCR began on 06 May 2013, the relocation of 18,200 Sudanese refugees from flood prone Jamam refugee camp, to the new site, Kaya, ahead of the onset of this year's seasonal rains.

Clashes between host and refugee communities in Doro camp illustrate the possible threat of civil unrest across Maban. Efforts are underway to bring the two communities together.

Over 95% of refugee children have been immunized during the national polio immunization campaign this month.

To date over 9,500 refugee children have been registered in camp schools in Doro, Gendrassa and Jamam.

# Yusuf Batil Monthly Updates

## Protection

Nine refugee suspects in the GOAL robbery and other crimes were arrested by SSNPS, which expressed frustration that refugees were committing violent crimes. UNHCR interviewed the suspects and deactivated the six members of the group who were registered after confirming that they were indeed armed elements. Later in the month - and also following violence between host community and Uduk members -, Maban County authorities in public meetings further denounced that armed refugees were committing crimes. UNHCR is concerned that such public displays will not result in effective crime prevention and repression but rather in the stigmatisation of the overwhelming number of law-abiding refugees.

2 productive boreholes in Batil completed this month. Replacement of lay flat hose with rigid pipes on going in Goal area. Solidarite is expecting to receive 2,300 m of pipes in the coming days. The last monitoring of latrines showed 47% are clean to compare to the week 8,9,10 where 87 % was reported clean. Only 58% of latrines have functional hand washing facilities and only 33 to 34% with soap and water. HEP E monitoring mechanism must be continued. 30 Latrines in schools have been completed.

\*\* Family latrines are shared among 4 families, based on a average household size of 5 members, to respect the standard of 20 persons per drop-hole

The crude and under five mortality kept below the emergency threshold. UNHCR and Partners provided primary health services to refugees and access improved to health posts. The most common cause of OPD consultations are LRTI , URTI, AWD and malaria. HepE outbreak is on-going since May 2012 and as of April 28, 2013, a total of 5,401 HepE cases and 139 deaths recorded since start of outbreak . Attack rate for symptomatic jaundice was 14.3% for epidemiological week 17. No other outbreak reported.

Targeted Supplementary feeding Programmes for children under five years, pregnant and lactating women resumed in April following one month of interruption.
