

Gendrassa Monthly Updates

Protection

By the end of April, preparations for biometric verification are in full swing. UNHCR and camp management are spreading messages on schedules and making preparations to support vulnerables. The experience of Doro demonstrated that through targeted measures such as transport assistance for vulnerables and repeated communication of messages on schedules the numbers of no-shows and inactivations can be reduced.

2 productive boreholes have been completed this month. Pumping tests are on going to determine the yield of these boreholes. 37 latrines were completed for schools. Decommissioning and replacement of latrines are continuing across the camp. Gendrassa shows good wash indicators with 14 persons per latrine and 25l /pers/day.

**Family latrines are shared among more or less 4 families, based on a average household size of 5 members, to respect the standard of 20 persons per drop-hole. A pourcentage higher than 100% means that in some cases latrines are shared among 3 families or less

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The crude and under five mortality kept below the emergency threshold. UNHCR and Partners provided primary health services to refugees and access improved to health posts. The most common cause of OPD consultations are LRTI, URTI, AWD and malaria. HepE outbreak is on-going since May 2012 and as of April 28, 2013, a total of 1,111 HepE cases and 14 deaths recorded since start of outbreak. Attack rate for symptomatic jaundice was 7% for epidemiological week 17. No other outbreak reported. Targeted and Blanket Supplementary feeding programmes for children under fives, pregnant and lactating women resumed in April following one month of interruption. IMC took over running of outpatient therapeutic feeding programme from MSF-H. The programme will be run at 4 nutrition centres.
