

Highlights

Refugees living in areas of Gendrassa affected by frequent rains declined to move to a UNHCR and PAE identified location despite being assured them that the location will be equipped with latrines and other facilities.

Two NGO partners, the American Refugee Council and GOAL departed the refugee operation in Maban after an official hand over of agreed to requirements to the local authorities and humanitarian community.

The identification of locations for the construction of semi-permanent schools in Gendrassa has been finalized. The production of bricks for the construction of schools in Gendrassa and Doro is ongoing.

Gendrassa Monthly Updates

Protection

Protection has been following up on a theft-case in which armed elements were involved. All four men from Gendrassa who were arrested for stealing and slaughtering goats admitted to be combattants for SPLA-N. Three of them were registered as refugees and consequently inactivated. UNHCR conducted interviews with the men in detention. South Sudanese authorities intends to hand over the criminals to SPLM-N shortly.

Distributions of uniforms and exercise books for all students in Gendressa is ongoing. 2 schools have been completed up to date. The semi permanent school construction is moving slow in Gendressa. Most of the materials were stocked in Jamam and there are issues with local authorities to move them to Gendressa. UNHCR has recovered the materials and some have been brought to Gendressa. ECCD activities are ongoing in all school locations. 96 teachers graduated from the English Language Teacher Training.

The final design of the water system is not yet known since Oxfam did not find high yield boreholes yet. 4 Blue pumps and 3 solar systems are operational. For the sanitation, the situation is normal. Oxfam will start the construction of permanent school latrines soon.

*Family latrines are shared among more or less 4 families, based on a average household size of 5 members, to respect the standard of 20 persons per drop-hole.

The crude and under five mortality kept within the emergency threshold. UNHCR in partnership with MSF-H and IMC provided primary health services to refugees and access improved through health posts. The most common cause of OPD consultations are LRTI, URTI, AWD and malaria. The trend of HepE outbreak increase and the HepE response has also strengthened and last weeks of July show in reduction of reported cases. Blanket mosquito nets distribution with health promotion and demonstration on use has done in camp. Both blanket and targeted SFP for children under five years, pregnant and lactating women continued in July. Outpatient therapeutic care also provided to SAM cases through IMC. 162 mother to mother support groups consisting of 12 mothers each met on a bi-weekly basis on breastfeeding and complementary feeding discussions. World Breastfeeding Week activities were completed.
