



NOTES:

A total of 37,531 new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2014; with 542 arriving from Burundi, 3 from Congo Brazzaville, 602 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 4 from Eritrea, 398 from Ethiopia, 1 from Pakistan, 1 from Russia, 32 from Rwanda, 748 from Somalia, 33,944 from South Sudan, 1,192 from Sudan, 63 from Uganda and 1 from Yemen. In addition, the Sub-Office has received 767 South Sudanese 'returnees' and their records reactivated; bringing the total arrivals figure to 38,298.

2,067 individuals were registered during the Thirtieth week of 2014 [20th - 26th July 2014]; 40 from Burundi, 52 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 1 from Eritrea, 11 from Ethiopia, 2 from Rwanda, 11 from Somalia, 1,437 from South Sudan, 55 from Sudan and 3 from Uganda. As at 28th July 2014, the overall registered population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stands at 169,280

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at 2.9 individuals. Family size 1 households represented 28.3% of all newly registered households.

Additionally, we have so far received approximately 42,440 individuals (as per records from DRA & Reception Centre) arriving from South Sudan *en masse* as a result of the ongoing conflict.



NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
