

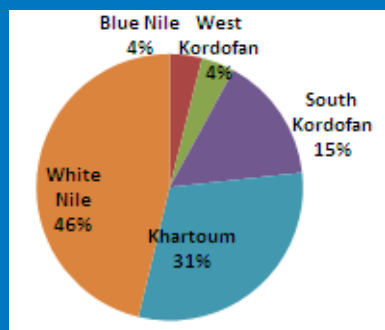

- Strengthen and improve the basic life-sustaining services in the relocation sites in White Nile State.
- Construct an additional 1,000 latrines in the relocation sites.

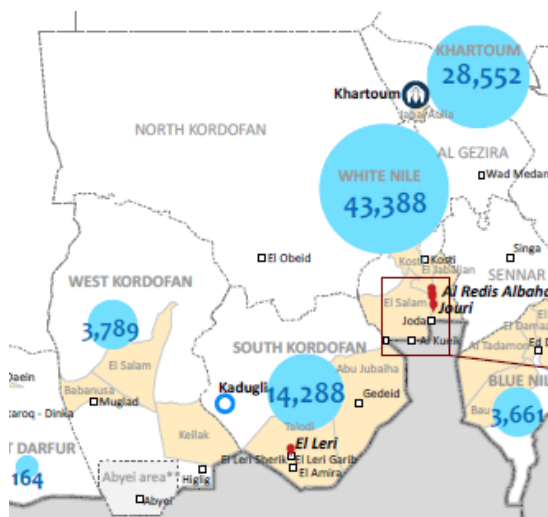
UNHCR OPERATIONAL UPDATE FOR SOUTH SUDAN

29th August – 4th September 2014

HIGHLIGHTS

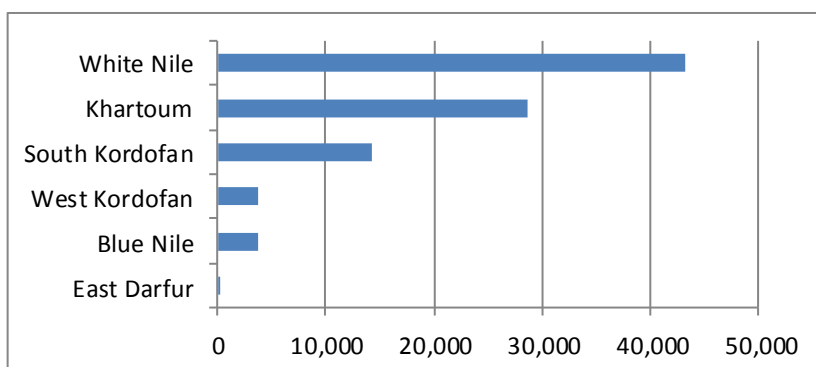
- UNHCR has been officially requested by the Ministry of Health (MOH) to support the facilitation of birth registration for all South Sudanese children born from January 2014, across sites in White Nile State.

- During the past week nutritional supplementary food was distributed to 1,474 malnourished children, 160 pregnant women, and 200 lactating mothers.
- The installation of three complete water provision systems has now been finalised for the relocation sites in White Nile State (El Kashafa, Al Redes, and Jouri). These consist of a pipeline network from the local river, two water tanks, and 3-4 water bladders in each site. These measures are now providing in excess of the minimum emergency water threshold of 20 litres of water per person per day.

UPDATE ON ACHIEVEMENTS

Operational Context

Access to South Sudanese populations residing in the White Nile and South Kordofan States remains a huge challenge due to ongoing problems caused by heavy rain. This is continuing to delay both the delivery of supplies, and access for humanitarian staff. UNHCR field monitoring teams have not been able to visit these sites since early August 2014; however, regular reports and updates on the situation are received from national partners working directly in the sites.

The general situation in South Kordofan remains stable, with no serious conflict related incidences reported in this reporting period.

Achievements



Protection

Achievements and Impact

- UNHCR, the Ministry of Social Welfare, and Plan Sudan will shortly launch an exercise to verify the exact number of separated and unaccompanied children (UASC) in the Al Alagaya site (White Nile State).
- A women's centre has been constructed at the Al Alagaya site (White Nile State).
- UNHCR and the Commission for Voluntary Humanitarian Work (CVHW) conducted relocation discussions with community representatives from the Shagara open area in Khartoum to discuss the upcoming relocation to another area on the outskirts of Khartoum.
- UNHCR organised meetings with South Sudanese community leaders in preparation for the forthcoming registration exercise. UNHCR has identified two sites in Khartoum to conduct the registration, and will provide tents and registration staff.
- UNHCR organised and facilitated a two day workshop on supporting extremely vulnerable individuals (EVIs) in the Khartoum open and residential areas. It was attended by forty delegates from the Commission for Voluntary Humanitarian Work (CVHW) and partners.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- No individual registration has taken place to date.



Education

Achievements and Impact

- Plan Sudan, alongside local communities, has refurbished the existing child friendly spaces in the relocation sites in White Nile State (El Kashafa, Al Redes, and Jouri) to be used as informal educational facilities. 1,170 children (521 boys and 649 girls) have been enrolled in basic education grades (1-5), and are receiving an informal education in mathematics, English, health education, sport and cultural activities.
- Plan Sudan organised training at the Ahfad University for Women in Khartoum for thirty four South Sudanese and host community teachers on psychosocial support for children.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- Formal education has not yet started in all locations across White Nile State (El Kashafa, Jouri, Al Redes, and Al Alagaya)



Health

Achievements and Impact

- Seven normal deliveries took place El Kashafa site, White Nile State.
- 800 patients attended the medical clinic in El Kashafa this week, the majority of whom came from the local host community.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- An increase in chest infections, malaria and diarrhea were reported due to the effects of heavy rainfall.
- There is an urgent need for mosquito nets in the open and residential areas of Khartoum.



Food Security

Achievements and Impact

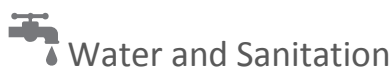
- This week the World Food Programme and the Sudanese Red Crescent Society confirmed food distributions consisting of sorghum, peanut oil and salt have been completed in the following sites across White Nile State:
- El Kashafa, Al Redes, and Jouri – 25,730
- Al Alagaya – 6,179



Nutrition

Achievements and Impact

- This week the World Food Programme delivered nutritional supplementary food across sites in White Nile State to benefit 1,474 malnourished children, 160 pregnant women and 200 lactating mothers.



Water and Sanitation

Achievements and Impact

- The installation of three complete water provision systems has now been completed for the relocation sites in White Nile State (El Kashafa, Al Redes, and Jouri). These consist of a pipeline network from the local river, two water tanks and 3-4 water bladders in each site providing in excess of the minimum emergency water threshold of 20 litres of water per person per day.
- This week Plan International Sudan, the Ministry of Health, and the Sudanese Red Crescent Society conducted hygiene promotion campaigns in the relocation sites across White Nile State benefitting over nineteen thousand individuals, and distributing 6,480 individual pieces of soap.

- A stock of NFI related WASH items is currently being prepared for delivery to Kharasana, in West Kordofan. The stock contains 3 bladder tanks (500 litre capacity), 100 jerry cans, 1,620 pieces of soap, 500 chlorine strips and 20 packages of chlorine.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- Heavy rains in the last week have delayed the construction of latrines in the Al Redes site in White Nile State.
- The Catholic Agency for Overseas Development (CAFOD) will shortly be covering the gap in the provision of latrines in the Al Alagaya site in White Nile State.



Shelter and NFIs

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- Lack of access to the White Nile relocation sites (El Kashafa, Jouri and Al Redes) is significantly impeding the delivery of NFIs of shelter items to new arrivals. New arrivals without individual shelters are currently being accommodated in UNHCR communal shelters and Sudanese Red Crescent Society tents.

Logistics

Achievements and Impact

- Preparations are being finalised with the authorities in Kosti and Khartoum for the launch of the transportation of humanitarian supplies to South Sudan.

Identified Needs and Remaining Gaps

- Due to the rainy season there is currently no access to sites in the following locations:
- El Kashafa, Jouri, and Al Redes – White Nile State
- Abu Gebiha and El Liri – South Kordofan.
- Full access to the above sites is expected in November 2014.

Working in partnership

- UNHCR has convened a series of meetings of protection actors in White Nile State and in South Kordofan State over the previous week.
