

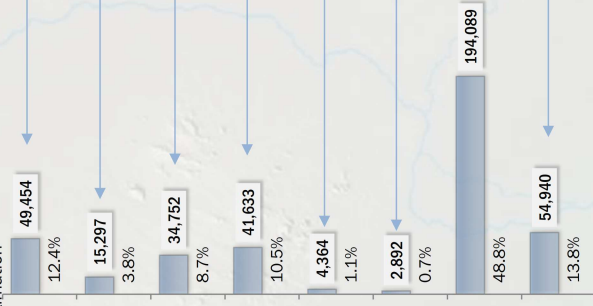
# Refugees in Ethiopia

Population figures: Estimation and Registration

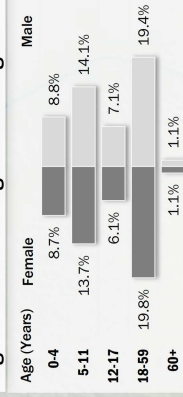
The past two years have seen the refugee population in Ethiopia nearly double. This is due to the influx of more than 100,000 Somalis into the Dollo Ado region, and a stream of Sudanese entering the country in the region around Assosa. A steady, but significant, number of Eritreans have also entered Ethiopia's Afar and Tigray regions. Ethiopia is now host to some 397,421 refugees: the largest groups are Somalis (60 per cent), Sudanese and South Sudanese (23 per cent) and Eritreans (17 per cent). In addition, there are a number of displaced people of concern from Kenya in the Moyale region, as well as urban refugees from several other countries, including Burundi, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Djibouti, Rwanda, Uganda and Yemen.

- 3,263 new arrivals mainly Somali registered in Dollo Ado sub office (535 ind.), Eritrean in Sub office Shire (1,365 ind.) and Sudanese in Western Ethiopia (936 ind.).
- 1,012 refugees were resettled mainly 467 from Kebribeyah, 157 from Urban locations and 175 from Shimelba.
- Revalidation exercise is ongoing in AFAR region.
- 1,350 Eritrean new arrivals planned to be transferred to the new camp
