




**United Nations Country Team in Turkey**  
**Daily Situation Report on the Situation Pertaining to Syria**

**April 16, 2012**

It has been reported officially that as of April 16, 2012 total camp population is reached to **24,056** persons with the arrival of 111 and return of 77 persons on April 15-16, 2012.

Population trends from December 16, 2011 to April 16, 2012 are reflected below.



Currently arrivals from Syria are assisted in the border provinces of Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis and Şanlıurfa.


As of April 16, 2012 the city breakdown in the region is as follows:

- Hatay population\* : 7,248 individuals
- Gaziantep population in Islahiye†: 5,897 individuals.
- Kilis population in Öncüpınar container site: 9,225 individuals
- Şanlıurfa population in Ceylanpınar: 1,629 individuals

\* : The population of the Kuyubaşı/Karbeyaz, Yayladağı 2 (YİBO), Altınözü I (TEKEL) and Reyhanlı camps in Hatay is moved to Islahiye camp in Gaziantep and to Öncüpınar container site in Kilis. It has been reported that these empty camps will be kept for while as standby and there is some use of these camps for new arrivals.

† : There are two locations in Islahiye; Nurdağı Sport Center and Islahiye tent city but population figure is for all.

Population movement from Hatay to Gaziantep (Islahiye Camp), Kilis (Öncüpınar Container site) and Şanlıurfa (Ceylanpınar), from March 15<sup>‡</sup> to April 16, 2012 is reflected below.

## 1. Highlights:

- ❖ It has been reported in the local daily newspaper “Asi” that 80 persons returned to Syria on Saturday April 14, 2012 from Reyhanlı.
- ❖ It has been reported in the local daily newspaper “Kent” that the Syrians who are living in the Kilis container site are selling the materials that they bought from Kilis markets, under small tents. They are also running barber shops, groceries and mini-restaurants. It has also been reported that entertainment groups are established for children.
- ❖ It has been reported in the local daily newspaper “Kent” that during 14-15 April, 22 Syrians arrived in Hatay through Yayladağı.
