




**United Nations Country Team in Turkey
Daily Situation Report on the Situation Pertaining to Syria**

June 27, 2012

No new figures reported on June 26 and 27, thus, the total number and the breakdown to be reported remains the same as the figure announced on 25 June 2012: overall camp population of **33,079** with the arrival of 322 and return of 71 persons on June 24-25, 2012.

The total number of registered persons from December 16, 2011 to June 25, 2012 is reflected below.




Currently arrivals from Syria are assisted in the border provinces of Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis and Şanlıurfa.

As of June 25, 2012 the city breakdown in the region is as follows:

- Hatay population* : 7,461 individuals
- Gaziantep population in Islahiye† : 5,853 individuals
- Kilis population in Öncüpınar container site: 10,412 individuals
- Şanlıurfa population in Ceylanpınar: 9,165 individuals

Population movement from Hatay to Gaziantep (Islahiye Camp), Kilis (Öncüpınar Container site) and Şanlıurfa (Ceylanpınar), from March 15[‡] to June 25, 2012 is reflected below.

1. Highlights:

*: The population of the Kuyubaşı/Karbeyaz, Yayladağı 2 (YİBO) and Reyhanlı camps in Hatay is moved to Islahiye camp in Gaziantep and to Öncüpınar container site in Kilis. It has been reported that these empty camps will be kept for while as standby and there is some use of these camps for new arrivals.

- ❖ UNHCR continues to provide with support to the Government of Turkey and is currently finalizing shipment of 2,000 family tents, 10,260 blankets and 2,016 kitchen sets from its stockpiles in Copenhagen and Amman through land and sea transport. Five trucks have arrived from Copenhagen and customs clearance has been completed by the Turkish Red Crescent during last week. The party from Amman has left on June 24 and expected to arrive at Mersin port on June 30. Funding support has been provided through a CERF package coordinated within the UNCT.
 - ❖ From May 24 to June 25 there has been an increase of 36 % in total number of Syrians currently provided temporary protection by Turkish Government.
 - ❖ Newly arrived persons are continued to be transferred to the Ceylanpınar Camp in Şanlıurfa and the current population of the camp is reached to 9,165 persons.
 - ❖ According to Anadolu News Agency preparations are underway to open a new camp in Akçakale in Şanlıurfa province for 10,000 persons.
