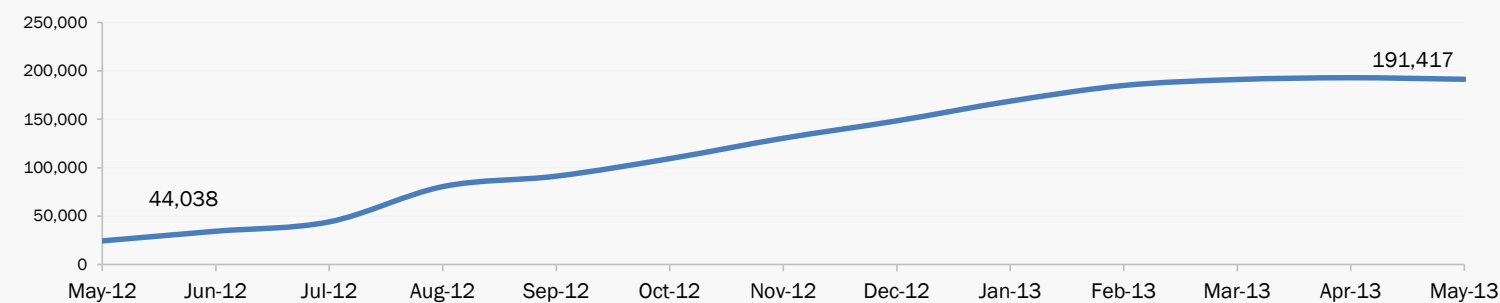
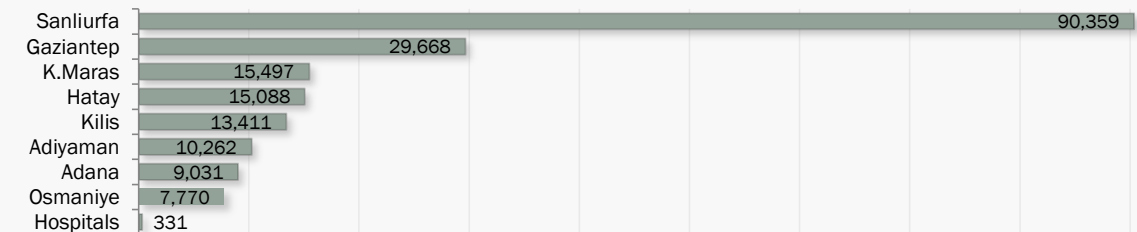


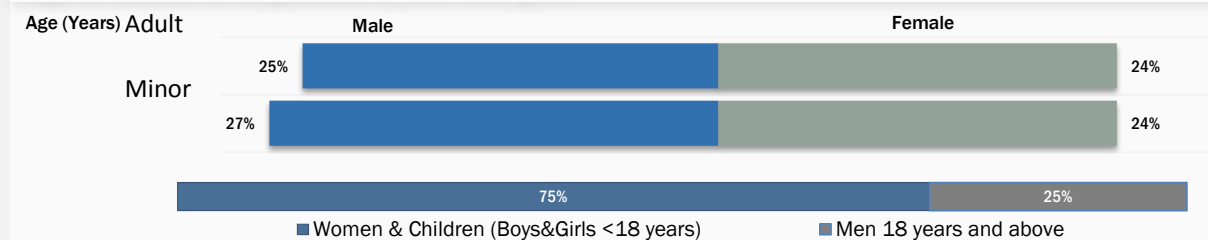

Highlights

- On 06 May 2013, AFAD - Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces have slightly decreased and is 191,417 including 331 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals.
- According to information from AFAD during the 24 hrs of 05-06 May, 143 new arrivals Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps while 2,108 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria during the same period of time. AFAD also reported on 06 May 2013 that since the beginning of the crisis, the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps was 300,517 and the number of voluntary returns is about 109 thousand (109,097).
- UNHCR Field Team visited the container site currently under construction in Kilis Elbeyli. The construction work is expected to be completed in the next few weeks with the capacity of more than 3,000 containers for up to 20,000 people. According to the information from various sources, some of the vulnerable Syrians with priority given to the disabled ones among the urban caseload will be prioritized to be accommodated in this new container site.
- MFA Regional Representative informed UNHCR that there are at least nine IDP camps (seven across the border of Hatay province, one across Kilis and one across Gaziantep province borders) hosting an estimated number of 50-60 thousand Syrians in these camps. Reportedly despite the support of several national and international NGOs, the situation is very difficult in these IDP camps. Apart from need for basic humanitarian items (food, shelter etc.) there is also a very big need for medical assistance including some basic medicines in these IDP camps.
- UNHCR Senior Regional Public Health Officer is on mission to the southeast region, meeting with the local authorities to identify the gaps and discussing the possible areas of support to the Government of Turkey to respond the medical assistance to the Syrians under temporary protection in Turkey.
- According to media reports the border crossing of the Akcakale continues to be closed.
