

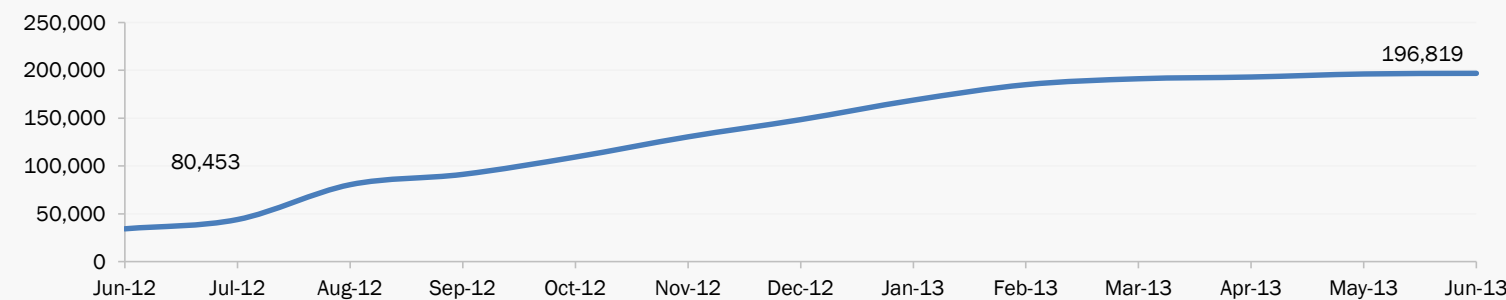

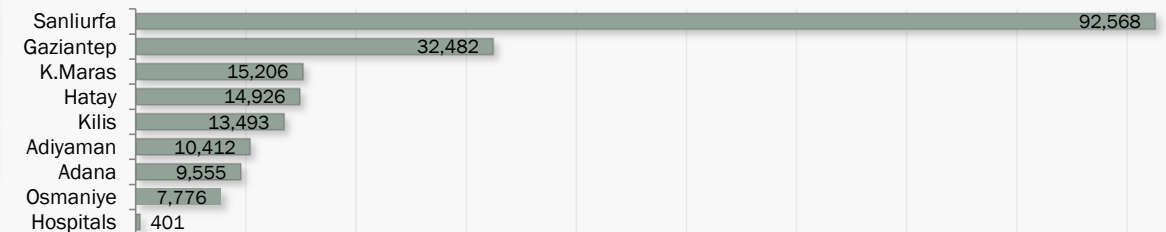

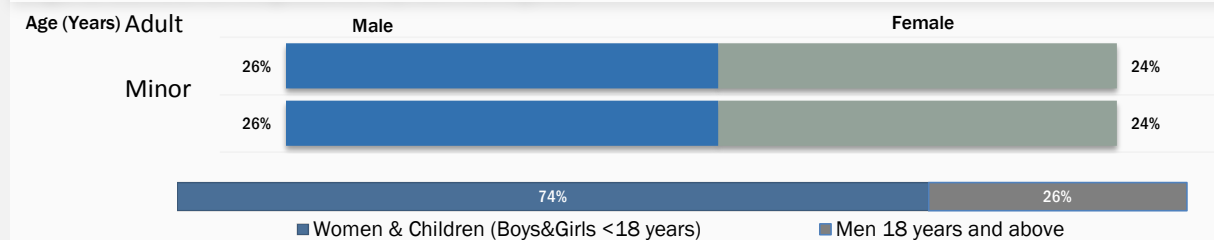

The number of Syrians living in the Urban Area are not included

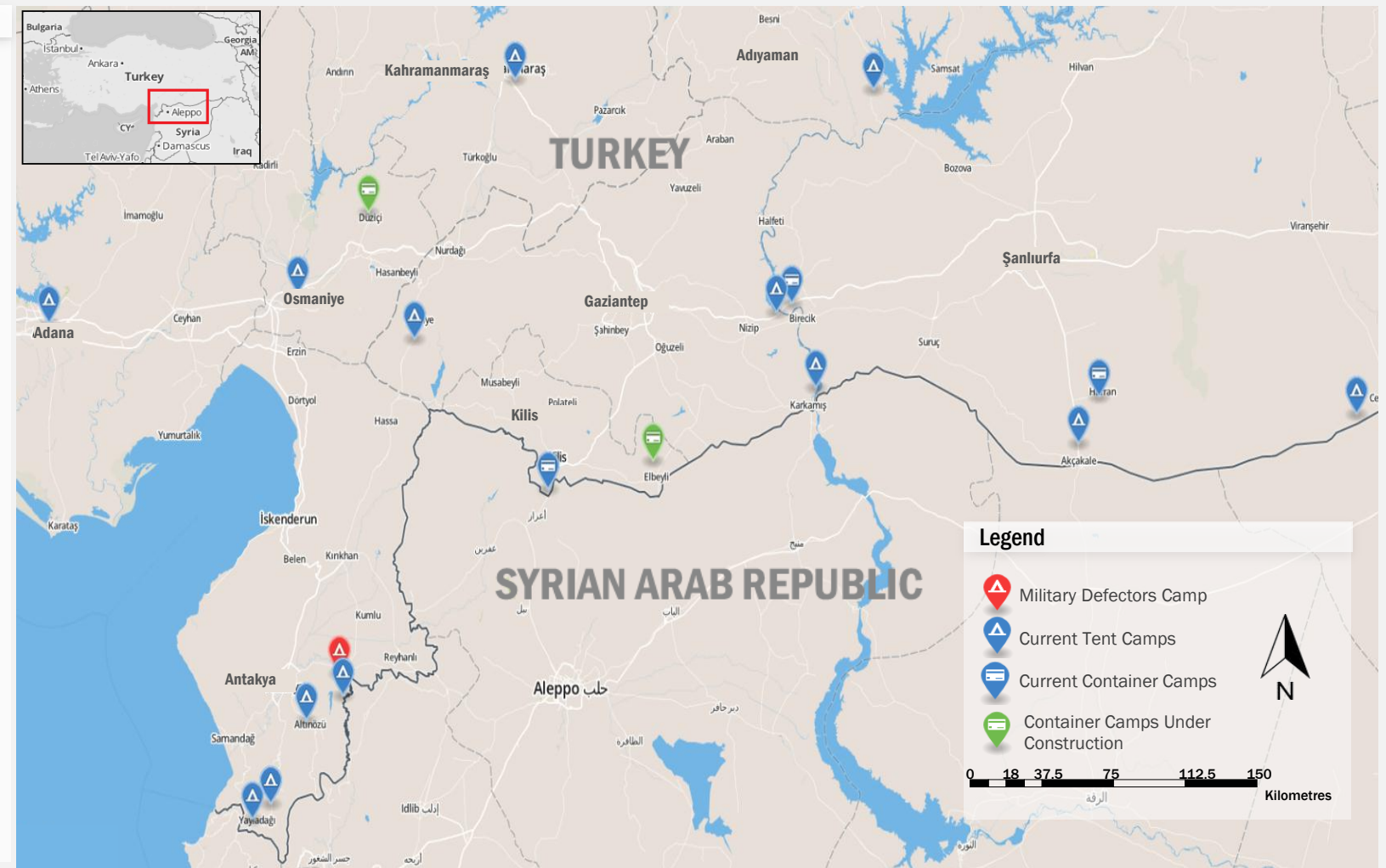


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 05 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 196,819, including 401 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 24hrs of 04-05 June 2013, 684 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 624 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Shortage of space in the camps continues to be the major challenge for the authorities. Almost all of the 17 camps are hosting more than their capacity. Frequently, new spontaneous arrivals directly approach the camps and the camp officials admit those who have close family ties in the camps, taking family unity into consideration.
- The local authorities underline the fact that they are having shortage of space in the camps, admissions of new arrivals from the borders are also based on the number of space available. Reportedly Government of Turkey continues to provide humanitarian assistance to those who are waiting across the borders. The major needs in the IDP settlements across the borders of Turkey are medical, food, and shelter. For food need, the authorities informed that, mobile kitchens will be established in some IDP camps to provide hot meals rather than daily food packages.
- In Harran Container site, the camp officials informed that they are working on a barcoded system for the NFIs in the camp warehouse. All the items will be barcoded and the distribution will be done with the ID cards of the camp residents linked to the same system which will also enable the camp management to follow up the distribution and stocks as well as the special items needed for the people in need of special items/equipment etc. A similar system is also in place in Osmaniye camp to monitor the distribution of the medicines.
