




Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 10 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 18 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 198,601, including 389 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. According to AFAD, there are no Syrians yet accommodated in the new camp in Mardin. AFAD reported that during the last 24hrs (09-10 June), 333 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 215 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Based on the information notes from AFAD, as of 10 June, the camps population has increased by 34% since beginning of 2013. During the first 10 days of June almost 7,000 Syrians were registered in the camps while some 4,700 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Following the opening of the second container site in Elbeyli, UNHCR has observed and was also informed by local NGOs, that the spontaneous new arrivals to the park in Kilis are increasing. Some of the Syrians living in the makeshift camp in the park also told UNHCR staff that every day 1-2 new families are arriving. Local NGOs informed that they have provided hot meal assistance to more than 3,500 Syrians on a daily basis. Syrians in the park have told UNHCR that they expected to be placed in the new camp. Some local authorities have informed UNHCR that that these Syrians will be placed in the new container site, while other officials have denied this information. According to the camp manager the priority will be given to the IDPs in Bab al Salame and the existing urban population in Kilis taking their vulnerability into consideration.
- Upon suggestion from UNHCR Field Team with Community Services Officer, the Camp Management in Kilis has agreed to have Focus Group Discussions in the camp on various topics, beginning with Education. Therefore the actors on education in the camp will be gathered and the first meeting will be co-facilitated by UNHCR Community Services Officer and the Camp management to map out the challenges and best practices to be used as a road map for possible solutions.
