

SYRIA


The escalation of violence has resulted in increasing numbers of internally displaced persons (IDPs) and stranded migrant workers or third country nationals (TCNs) in need of humanitarian assistance in Syria.



IOM provides emergency winter and hygiene non food items (NFIs) to Syrian IDPs in Damascus, Rif Damascus, Homs, As Suwayda and Raqqa.

IOM also provides emergency repatriation for TCNs to their countries of origin. Most assisted TCNs originate from Philippines, Sudan, Egypt, Yemen, Ukraine, Romania, Indonesia and Burkina Faso.

IRAQ

IOM distributes emergency NFIs to Syrian refugees at Domiz camp and Al-Qaim camp, and to vulnerable Iraqi returnees in the Nineweh host community. As of 18 Oct., over **4,000** people have benefited from distributed blankets, mattresses, pillows, hygiene kits, gas stoves, kerosene heaters, and carpets, etc.

JORDAN

Since the end of July, Syrian refugees fleeing violence have crossed into Jordan in ever-increasing numbers, necessitating transportation to Za'atri refugee camp, health checks/referrals to camp clinics and reception services.

IOM's health team provides tuberculosis (TB) screening and awareness-raising activities. As of 8 Nov., IOM screened **28,252** Syrians and provided **28,237** with TB awareness-raising activities in the camp, transit centres, and host communities in Jordan. IOM's medical team confirmed **12** TB cases and is providing follow-up treatment for 11 cases.

LEBANON

As of 8 Nov., IOM has distributed over **9,618** emergency NFIs (rechargeable lamps, diaper bags, housecleaning kits, winter and shelter sealing items) to **58,360** Syrian refugees and Lebanese returnees. Host community distribution sites are located in Wadi Khaled, Bekaa (Baalbeck and Hermel districts).

IOM also profiles and maps Lebanese returnees and organizes psychosocial forums for Syrian refugees and Lebanese returnees in Baalbeck.



TURKEY

As of 7 Nov., IOM has provided over **27,000** emergency NFIs to displaced Syrians in five different camp sites in Turkey.

The NFI kits include critical winter items and essential household items such as blankets, mattresses, pillows, beds and kitchen sets. IOM has also provided **17** shower and **8** WC containers for use in Ceylanpinar and Karkamis camps.
