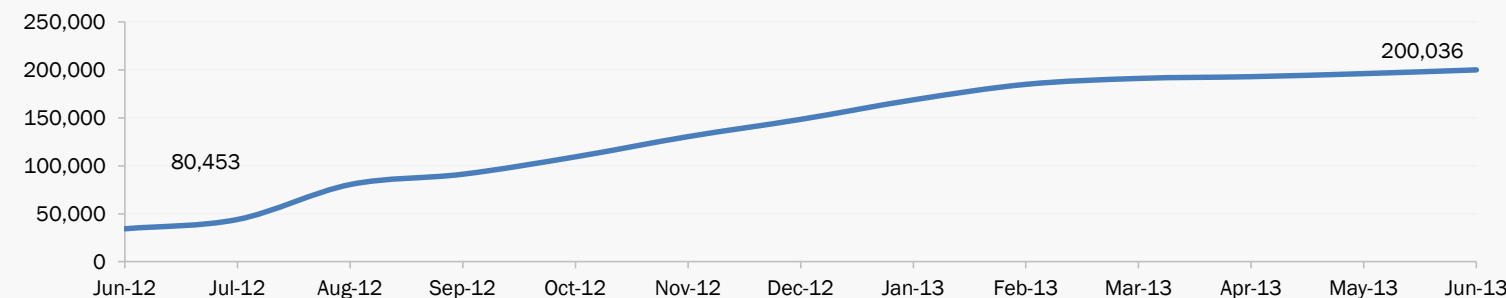

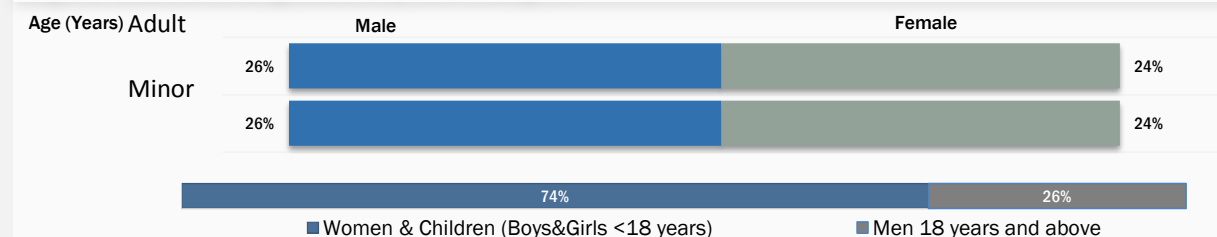

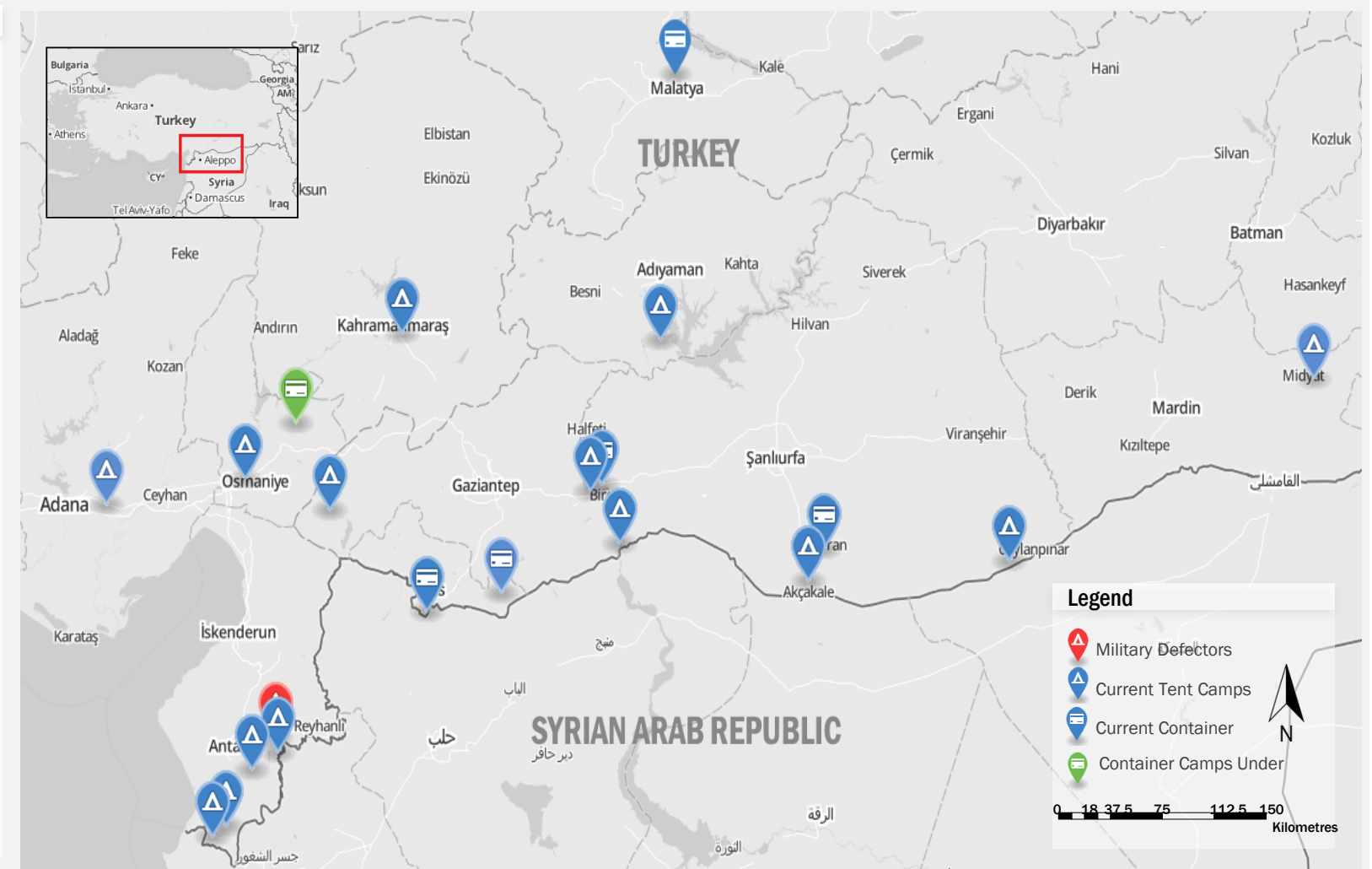


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 25 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 20 camps in 10 provinces is 200,012 with a slight decrease from the day before. The total number includes 396 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. On 25 June no figures of new arrivals and voluntary returns were reported by AFAD. The cumulative new arrivals since the beginning of the crisis is 332,830 Syrians provided with camp accommodation and 132,818 voluntary returns to Syria from camps.
- UNHCR Field Team visited Mardin Midyat tent site met with the camp officials and informed UNHCR's role and offered its support and expertise on registration, voluntary repatriation and various other protection related issues. The camp management informed UNHCR Field team that the camp population is 343 Syrians of whom 301 were transferred from Nizip and the rest from Reyhanli urban areas. The camp management expect that an additional 60 people will be transferred from Reyhanli. During the visit the camp manager also informed UNHCR Team that 13 people are registered with the camp but have been given permission to live in the urban area with relatives. Two people voluntarily returned to Syria from the camp, and their interview was observed by the UNHCR Field team.
- In Ceylanpinar camp, the camp management is preparing to transition from a hot meal food distribution to a food voucher card system. While the construction of the market is ongoing, the local officials also conducted a census in the camp to establish the number of people accommodated in the camp. According to the unofficial findings after the census, there are about 14,235 Syrians residing in the camp and more than 19,000 registered in the camp and given permission to live with host families.
- UNHCR Field Team was informed by the local authorities that the admission of some more than 3,500 Syrians identified in Jarablus is ongoing. Reportedly, some 300 people are admitted on a daily basis and transferred to Malatya container site. The camp population of Malatya has reached nearly 2,000 since its opening one week ago. UNHCR Field Team will visit the camp during the week to share expertise and inform the officials on UNHCR's role in voluntary returns if they will have in the future.
