

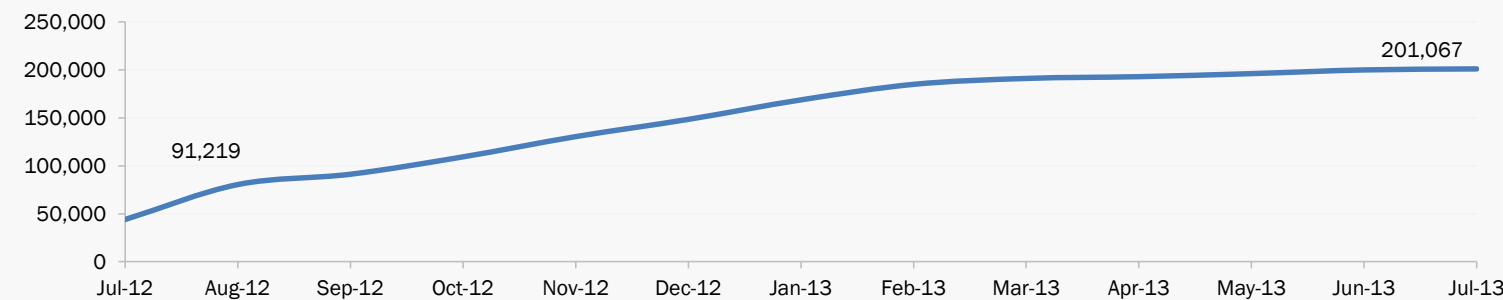

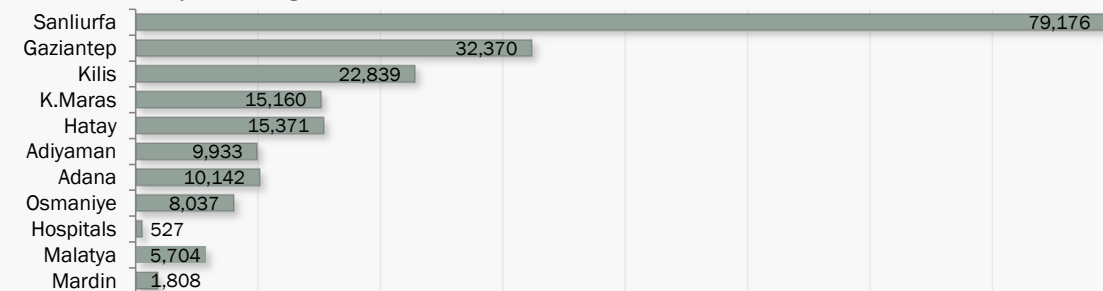

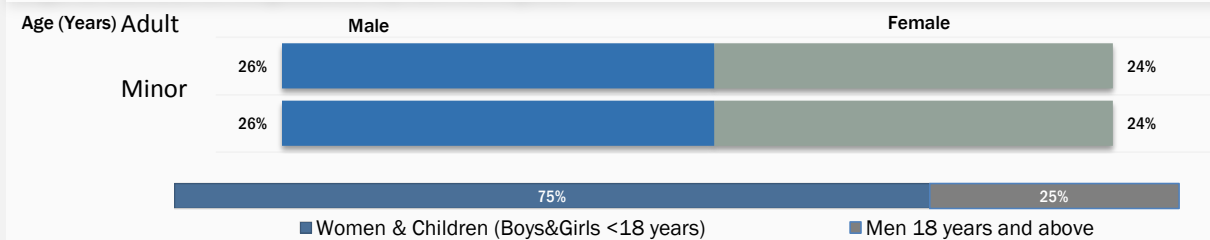

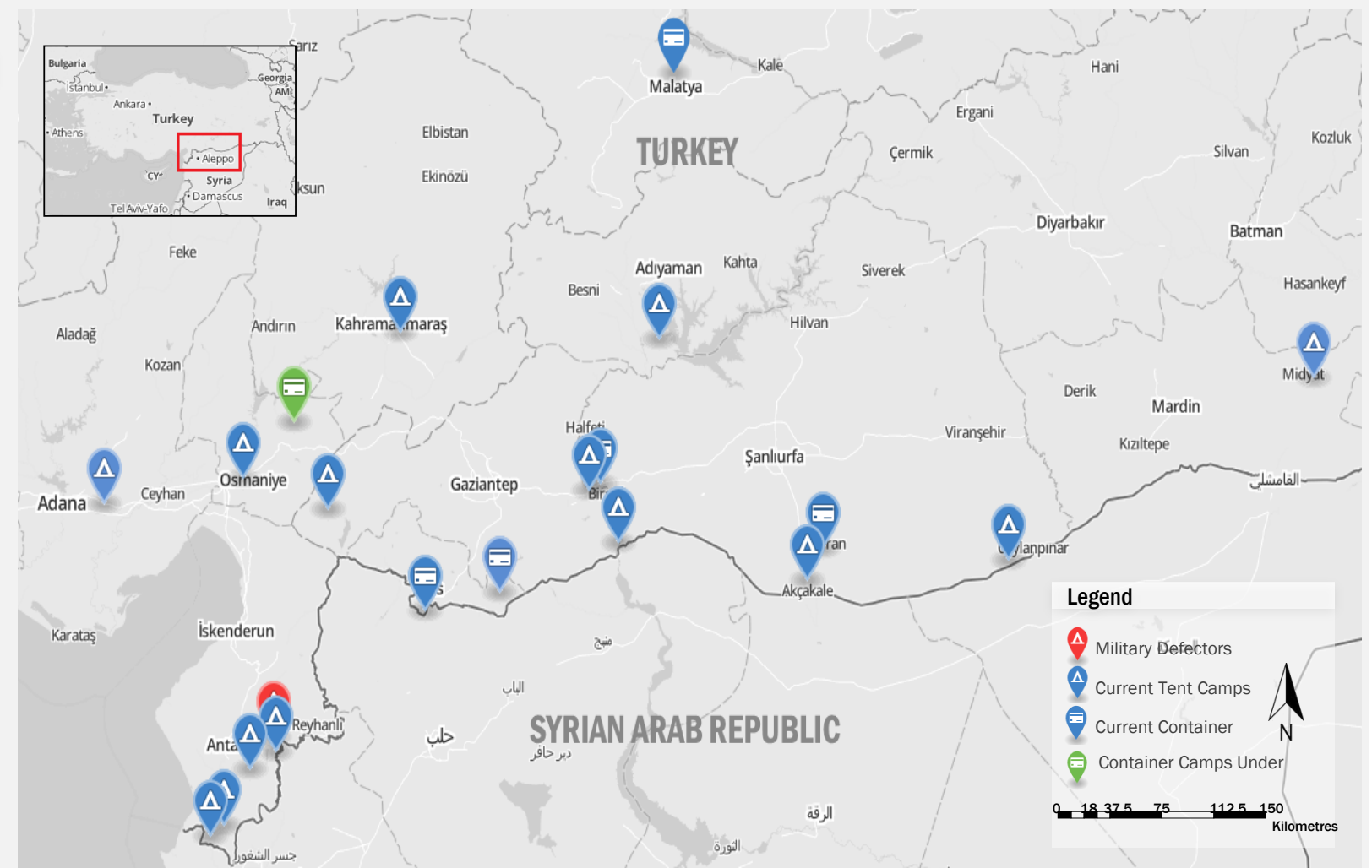


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 22 July 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was 201,067, including 527 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during 24 hrs. from 21 to 22 July 2013, 396 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 348 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The UNHCR Field Office has been in close contact with the local officials in Sanliurfa province as well as in both Akcakale and Ceylanpinar camps for the updated situation on the possible increase in new arrivals. As reported in the national media, and also reported by the local officials, while the situation had reportedly been calmer in Ras-Al Ayn across Ceylanpinar, fighting has intensified in Tel Abyad across Akcakale. Local officials in Akcakale reported that the border is open: However, there has not been any influx since the clashes started. Local officials reported that during the weekend, some 260 persons crossed to Turkey through unofficial border crossing points and were admitted and transferred to the camps.
- Local officials of both Nizip camps, including the sub-governor, organized a communal iftar (fast breaking dinner) together with the refugee representatives with the camp management staff. UNHCR was also invited to the dinner. In Malatya, the camp management continues to take the refugees in groups to the similar gatherings organized by the local community in town.
- The Islahiye camp manager informed UNHCR Field Team that of those Syrians staying in the mosque next to Islahiye camp, about 90 people were transferred to Mardin Midyat camp, and some 100 wanted to return to Syrian voluntarily: 50 people were provided transportation to Reyhanli and 50 people to Hacipasa village of Altinozu - Hatay.
- Local NGOs providing daily hot meals to the Syrians in the Musalla Park in Kilis informed UNHCR Field Team that approximately 280 families are still living in the park. One of the Syrian representatives of the people in the park stated that during the weekend, about 160 new arrivals came to the park. Reportedly, the new arrivals are coming from Idlib.
