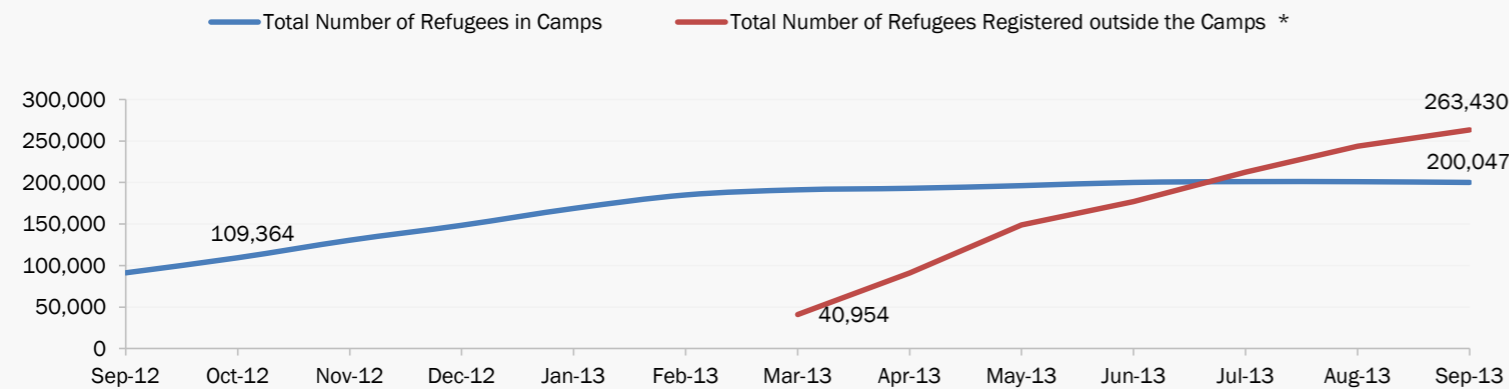
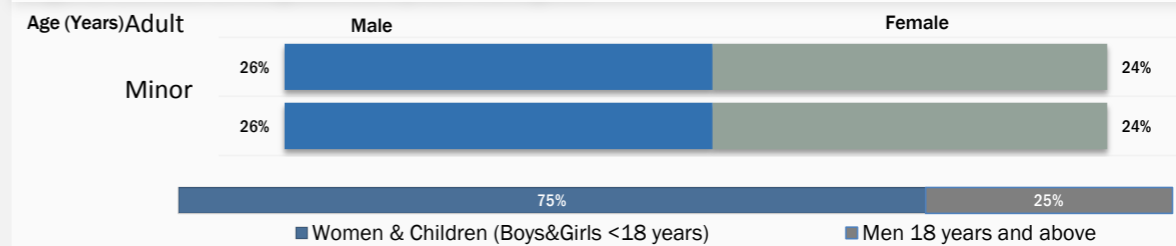

## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 01 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,061, including 623 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 30 Sept-01 Oct. 2013, a total of 366 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 352 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Local officials informed a UNHCR Field Team that the Kilis/Oncupinar border gate is closed for security reasons because of the ongoing fighting across the border. According to the unofficial sources, the fighting is between factions of the opposition for control of the border gate of Bab Al-Salame. UNHCR checked with local officials of Reyhanli, Akcakale and Karkamis border gates and reportedly all 3 border gates are open to passport holders. Because the Kilis/Oncupinar customs gate is closed, the number of crossings from/to Cilvegözü and Bab Al-Hawa increased to about 1,500 persons per day. In addition to the passport holders, officials also informed that wounded people, and a limited number of other Syrians are admitted each day upon request from AFAD, depending on the spaces available in the camps. According to information provided by the local officials in Karkamis, some 370 Syrian IDPs were admitted from Jarablus and transferred to Malatya Beydagi container site.
- In Karkamis, camp officials informed that in order to absorb the spontaneous arrivals of those who claim to have relatives in camp, and those who are already staying with their relatives as guests, they are planning to add some additional tents while renewing the old tents. As of reporting date, AFAD reported that there are 1,636 family tents established in the camp with more than 7,000 Syrians accommodated in the camp.
- The registration of the new arrivals and of the Syrians living in the camps is on-going. Camp officials informed UNHCR that they are registering the Syrians residing in the camps, while digital finger printing is done by the police. Reportedly the new digital finger printing system allows the officials to trace double registrations in other camps.
- In Islahiye, the police informed UNHCR Field Team that they have enumerated more than 6,000 non-camp Syrians (about 700 families) living in Islahiye town. In Akcakale, camp officials informed that about 1,000 Syrians who are accommodated in rub hall tents have been registered and issued their camp ID cards. However, since they have not yet been provided family tents, they have not been included in the food card system set up by AFAD in that camp, but are still provided hot meals. Reportedly, in addition to these 1,000 Syrians, it is estimated by the camp officials that there are still several thousands living with their relatives in the same tents.
