



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>527,223</b>




## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 27 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 205,398 including 161 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of (26-27 Nov. 2013) 474 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 381 Syrians have returned to Syria.
- Camp officials in Ceylanpinar informed UNHCR that the renovation in Ceylanpinar is still on-going. Reportedly, while the residential tents are being replaced with the new UNHCR donated tents, the management is installing additional UNHCR tents for spare capacity. During the renovation, the police is also re-registering the camp residents into the same data base provided by Ministry of Interior. The registration staff informed that they will be increasing the work-stations of registration desks in order complete the registration soon.
- In Sanliurfa, AFAD Coordination Center continues to register the non-camp Syrians until the police takes over. Officials of the center informed UNHCR that the total number of registered non-camp Syrians in Sanliurfa province increased over 57,000 of whom 39 % are in city center and 26% are in Akcakale town. The foreigners police in Sanliurfa informed that about 5% of them have ikamets (temporary residence permit).
- The fire department in Adana is training the camp residents and local staff on how to use a fire extinguisher. Reportedly a tent was burnt to simulate the intervention and camp residents managed to extinguish it successfully. The training will also be conducted for the camp's security staff.
- In Adiyaman camp, the camp manager informed that the registration of the camp residents is on-going and about 60% of the camp residents have been registered and fingerprinted in the new data base. The new ID cards will soon be distributed. With regards to the non-camp Syrians, officials in Adiyaman informed that so far they have a low number of Syrians registered by AFAD in Adiyaman. Once the registration of the camp residents is completed, one of the work stations in the camp will be moved to the town of Adiyaman to register non-camp Syrians into the new system.
