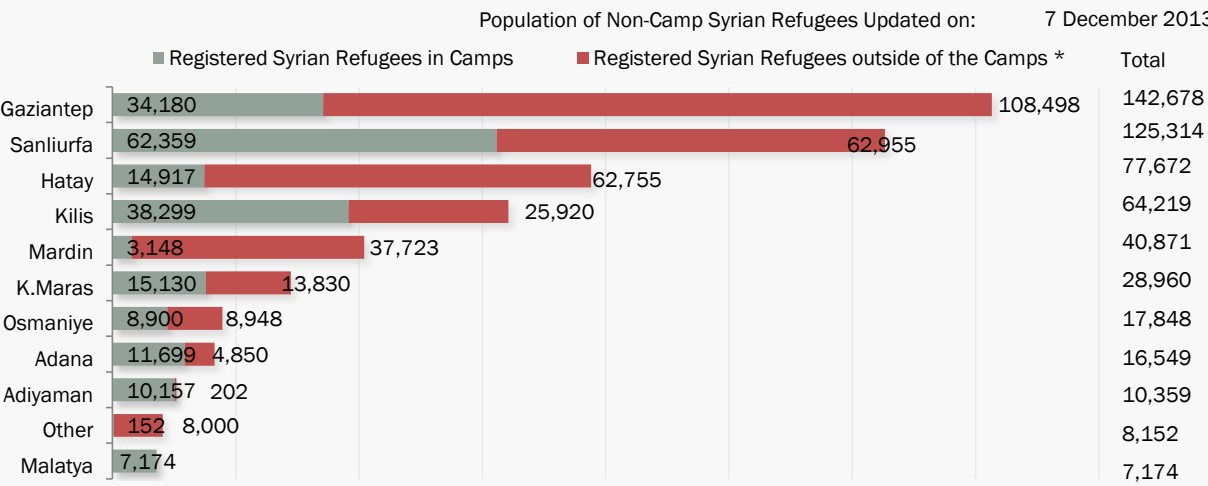
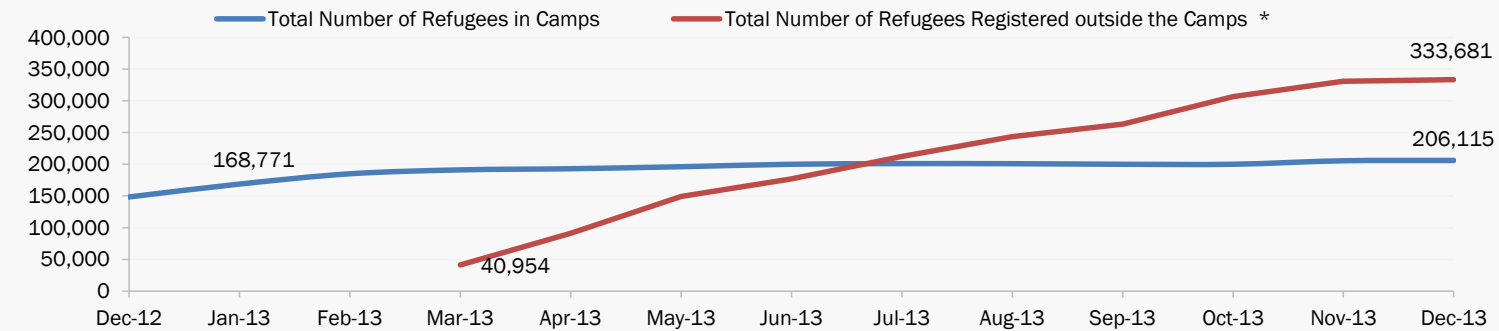

Highlights

- On 10 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps and one Transit Center in 10 provinces was 206,115 including 152 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. of 09-10 Dec. 2013, 498 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 223 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Although it has not yet been reflected in the AFAD statistics, camp officials in Viransehir camp informed UNHCR that the number of Syrians accommodated in the camp is now 1,254 persons. In Kilis, the officials in the transit center stated that they are intending to transfer all the residents of the transit center to Viransehir camp because of the inadequate conditions in the center for the winter. In addition, officials intend to send the unregistered people in Kilis Oncupinar camp to Viransehir camp as Oncupinar camp does not have vacant containers.
- In Adana, Osmaniye and Hatay camps officials informed UNHCR that they are working on establishing a libraries. While some of the camp officials stated that they have established contacts with some donors to provide the books in Arabic, the management of Adana camp asked whether UN Agencies could provide various classical novels in Arabic.
- During the previous week, UNHCR field team observed that in Nizip-1 tented camp, the living conditions of those in temporary accommodation in the waiting tents (rub hall tent) are not appropriate and it was advised to the camp management to explore transfer to other camps. Reportedly there are about 360 persons staying in the waiting tent. The camp officials stated that they are prioritizing the most vulnerable with immediate needs to be accommodated in family tents as tents become vacant. Since Viransehir camp is open, UNHCR will propose to the sub-governorate to consider the transfer to Viransehir camp.
- UNHCR was informed that the graduates of high school (12th grade) last year have received their diplomas signed by Libyan Ministry of Education. Last school semester the Syrian students in the 12th grade studied the Libyan curriculum.
