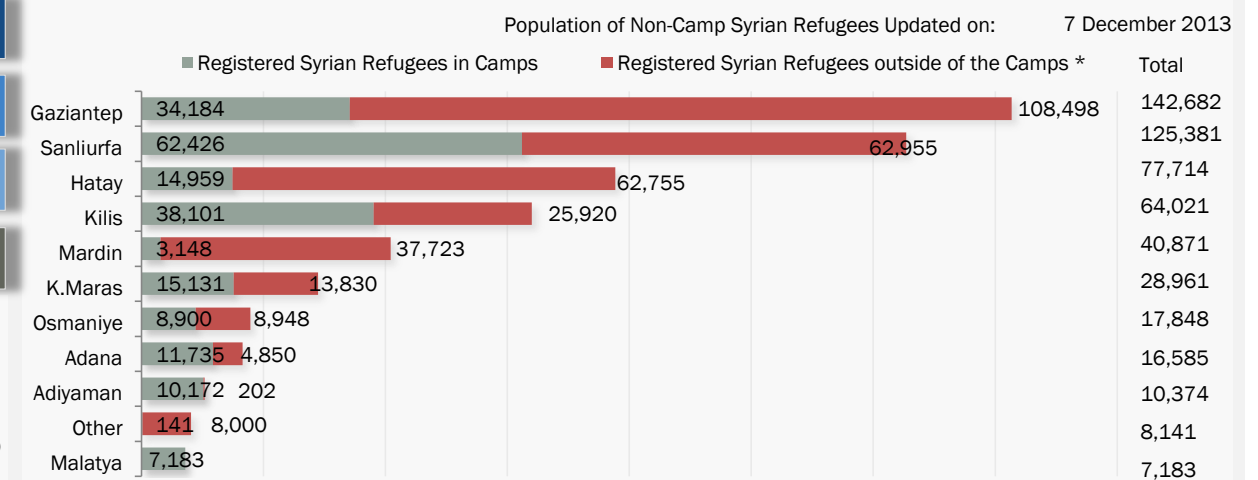
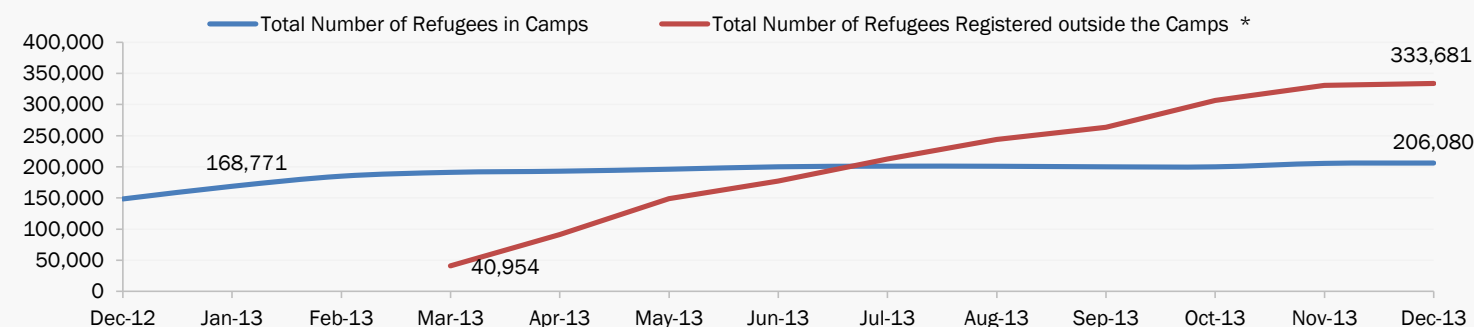


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>539,761</b>

## Highlights

- On 12 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps and one transit center in 10 provinces was 206,080 including 141 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. of 11-12 Dec. 2013 238 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 827 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- It was reported in the national media that that Cilvegözü border gate in Reyhanli was closed by the Government of Turkey for security reasons. Reportedly there was a fight between the opposition groups over the control of Bab Al Hawa gate and Turkish Government Ministry of Customs and Trade announced that the border gate is closed for commercial traffic and passengers exit and entry.
- In Ceylanpinar, the camp management agreed to establish the women's committee. Initially 17 women volunteered and the management is encouraging to increase the number of volunteers to 22. When all members are identified, the group will work on voluntary basis initially for 3 months and then they will organize elections for the committee members.
- In Akcakale camp 300 women elected the 24 members for the women's committee 2 for every 10 district and 4 for administrative issues. Each pair of district representatives will select their working groups, consisting of 5-10 women, covering various issues.
- In Mardin Midyat camp, both women and youth committees were elected and UNHCR met with the youth committee. UNHCR provided guidance and advice to the camp management and the youth committee on how they can work with the women's committee. The committee members signed their Code of Conduct.
- The transfers continued to the newly opened camp in Viransehir. Reportedly when all the people in the transit area in Kilis are transferred to Viransehir camp, the local officials are intending to do some renovations in the center, remove the rub hall tents and replace them with family tents.
- On 13 Dec 2013, UNHCR was informed by the local officials that the Government of Turkey wanted to admit up to 150 Syrian families from Bab Al Salame to be accommodated in Elbeyli container site in Kilis. However due to a dispute between the local entities on who would be allowed to go to Turkey, only 15-20 vulnerable people were admitted and the other admissions were postponed.
