NEEDS

- Households have access to basic and domestic items (NFIs)
- Persons with specific needs are supported (NFIs)
- Basic needs of Syrian refugees in camps and urban settings are met (NFIs)
- Sufficient supplies received in time (Logistics)
- Establishment of logistics system for contingency purposes, including a central warehouse, core relief items stockpiling and transport arrangements/distribution

KEY DEVELOPMENTS

The Government of Turkey (GoT) takes the lead role in determining NFI requirements for the refugees in camps.

Procurement process of 240,000 high-thermal blankets for winterization assistance by UNHCR is underway. Delivery is expected by mid-January.

Procurement process for contingency (preparedness) items (kitchen sets, medium blankets, jerry cans, sleeping mats, rubhalls) for 40,000 Syrians has been completed by UNHCR. Delivery of the items to Turkish Red Crescent Society warehouse was completed.

Procurement of the 23 mobile registration/coordination centers for AFAD by UNHCR is ongoing. During November, 6 of the centers were delivered to AFAD, with a total of 7 delivered so far. 11 additional mobile registration/coordination centers are planned to be procured for the Directorate General of Migration Management.

Delivery of the 2,550 electric heaters (oil-filled radiators) to camps where there was an urgent need due to early onset of the winter conditions (1,850 to Malatya Camp, 700 to Mardin camp) was completed in November by UNHCR.

Twelve Containers (6 shower and 6 latrine) were procured by IOM within November. Two of the shower and two of the latrine containers were provided to Kilis Reception Centre, where over 3,000 persons are residing. The remaining containers have been constructed in Nusaybin camp where there is expected to be 20,000 persons.

The Government of Turkey takes the lead role for determining and implementing assistance provided to Syrian refugees, through the Prime Ministry Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency (AFAD). AFAD reports spending over 2 billion USD on the Syrian Refugee Response in Turkey.

ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE



39,500 mini-fridges delivered for distribution in the camps.



36,260 metal cupboards delivered for distribution in the camps.



34,760 hot-plate cookers delivered for distribution in the camps.



63,701 children in the camps provided with T-shirts and jeans.



3,499 blankets distributed.



150,000 children in the camps to be provided with winter clothing (procurement in progress)



Distribution of **18,500** tents that were procured in 2012 completed.



34 mobile coordination / registration centers in procurement; of which **7** have been delivered to AFAD (**6** in November)



240,000 high thermal blankets for winterization in procurement.



518 wheelchairs procured and delivered.



Contingency items (kitchen sets, medium blankets, jerry cans, sleeping mats, rubhalls) for **40,000** persons procured and kept in stock.



2,550 oil-filled radiators for winterization delivered for distribution (all in November); procurement of **13,800** additional being planned.



21 WASH containers (12 showers and latrines and 9 dishwashing containers) provided to camps. (12 within November)



316 WASH (dishwashing) containers being planned for procurement.



12,606 blankets, bed sheets, pillows and mattresses distributed to 7 camps.



25 VSAT equipment provided across all the camps to support coordination of registration.



4 ACs were provided for a clinic for urban refugees, to serve up to 25,000 Syrians living out of camps.
