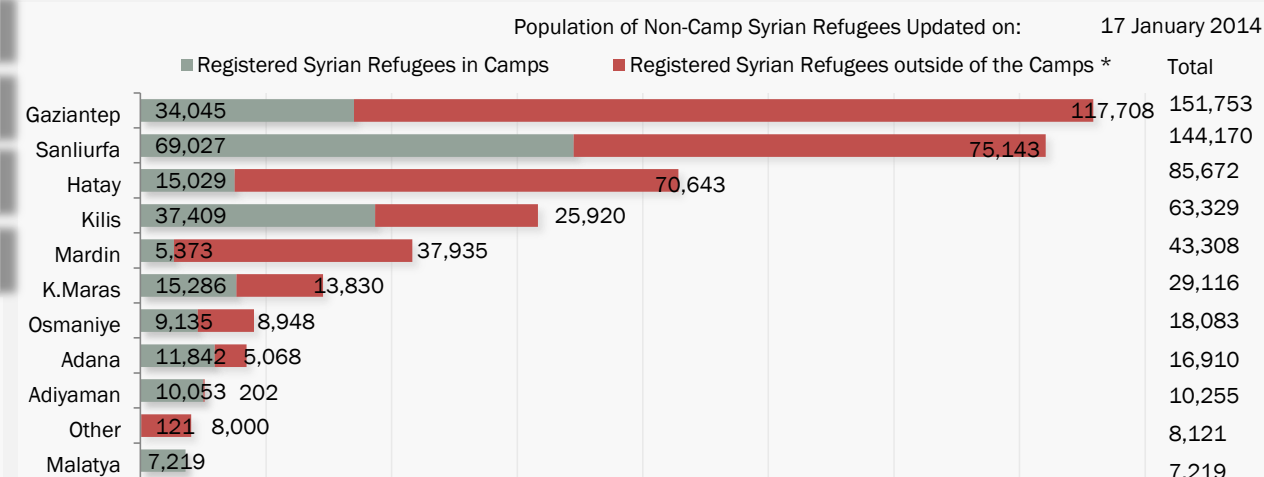
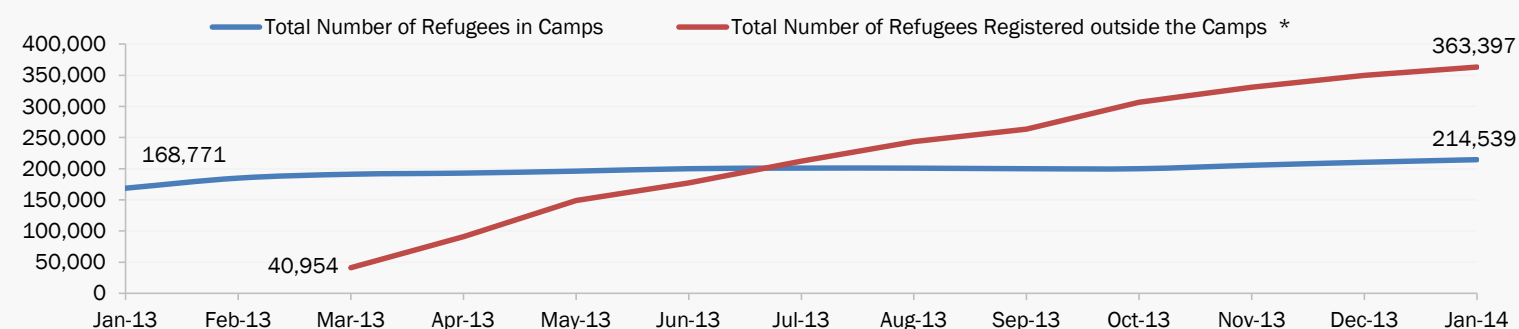

Highlights

- On 22 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 214,539 including 121 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 21-22 Jan 2014, a total of 824 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 380 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Gaziantep, UNHCR was informed by provincial AFAD Officials that 1,440 Syrians of both Turcoman and Arab origin have crossed from Jarablus to Karkamis and were initially accommodated in sports hall (1,140 persons) and public funeral center (300 persons) temporarily for 1-2 nights and as per instruction from AFAD Hq, they were all transferred to the camps in Gaziantep (Islahiye, Karkamis and Nizip-1). Reportedly this will also be temporary accommodation until further instruction from AFAD. It was also reported by local officials that about 8,000 more Syrians are still across the border and reportedly wants to come to Turkey however due to shortage of accommodation in the existing camps, action will be taken in consultation with central Government officials (AFAD, and Prime Ministry office).
- Those 400 persons who were sent to Karkamis camp, were temporarily accommodated in the rub hall tents that are used as kindergarten until their transfer to a camp where space is available in coordination with AFAD Hq. UNHCR Field Team spoke to some of these new arrivals who stated that they were IDPs in a camp near Jarablus and because of the intensified fights, the IDP camp was attacked and many people run away due and came to Turkey..
- In Sanliurfa, UNHCR Field Team was informed that about 1000-1500 Syrians have started to gather across the fences, near a village called Oncul (about 1,5 km east of Akcakale). During the day Akcakale officials admitted the refugees further to the authorisation of the Central Government officials. Local officials waiting to receive the instruction for their placement in a camp.
- According to information from the local officials in Sanliurfa, during the period of last two weeks, about 10,000 Syrians have been admitted from the border line of Sanliurfa province. Reportedly more than 1,500 Syrians have returned to Syria voluntarily while others are staying with their relatives in Akcakale and nearby villages.
