

## Highlights

- On 27 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 214,968 including 104 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 26-27 Jan 2014, a total of 499 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 199 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR was informed by camp officials of Islahiye, Nizip-1 and Karkamis that those who were transferred to these camps during last weekend are still being accommodated in the rub hall tents until further instruction from AFAD for their transfer to other camps where space is available. Reportedly about 1,440 Syrians were admitted from Jarablus border gate when ISIS took the control of Jarablus town. UNHCR is in contact with both local officials as well as with central government officials for the placement and registration of these people in camps where they are accommodated.
- UNHCR, started to distribute cash assistance to vulnerable non-camp Syrians living in five provinces (Kilis, Gaziantep, Nizip, Reyhanli and Yayladagi) through Turkish NGO Kimse Yok Mu. The vulnerable families have been identified by Kimse Yok Mu in advance and the cash assistance is delivered through a Bank card. The assistance will gradually rolled out to other provinces hosting large number of non-camp Syrian refugees. UNHCR is preparing a SOP for cash assistance to ensure the quality and consistency of the assistance.
- Nine additional mobile registration units are being delivered to AFAD Ankara this weekend, which brings the total of delivered registration units to 23. This completes the agreed material support by UNHCR to the registration activities by AFAD, that aims at reaching and identifying the refugees outside of the camps. UNHCR was informed by the local officials that already 6 of them were sent to the field - Sanliurfa (2), Hatay (2), Gaziantep (1) and Mardin (1). Local officials in Kilis are also expecting to receive one soon.
- Local officials in Hatay informed that one of the mobile registration units is stationed in Reyhanli and the other one in Kirikhan. Reportedly both have started to register non-camp Syrians living in the town centers and then will continue with those living in the villages and rural areas of Hatay province.
