Additional Sector Information

CVT provides trauma rehabilitative services to Iraqi and Syrian refugees of all ages and gender who are experiencing the effect of war and torture. The rehabilitative services include: Mental Health Counseling (individual; group; family); Physiotherapy (individual and group); Social Services Referrals and Case Management. In addition to providing direct trauma rehabilitative services CVT trains members of the community and refugee population to be skilled psychosocial counselors, physiotherapists, advocates, educators and trainers.

Geographic Focus

In 2014, CVT plans to intervene in Amman and Zarqa governorates in Health.
