Mission

The **Foundation for the Social Promotion of Culture** is a private, non-profit organisation which **since 1987** works in favour of human development and the promotion of culture. Its foundational goals are centred on the different realities of the countries in which it works, and on the priorities and proposals of the local partners, beneficiaries and co-funding institutions with which it works, in a clear response to demands and social problems.

Its philosophy settles on a model of **“small, agile and independent organization”** that allows it to strengthen and to capitalize the realized work and to attack the future challenges over a high capacity of management, optimization of resources and cost economy. It is the third country in the Middle East, after Lebanon and the Palestinian Territories, where the FPSC has a greater presence and activity. FPSC is present in Jordan since 1994, when a project aimed at generating employment and the training of women was implemented. Since that intervention, the Foundation has managed projects in Jordan, that have been funded by AECID, Generalitat Valenciana, Reina Sofia Foundation, OFID, OCHA and EU.

Jordan is the third country in the Middle East, after Lebanon and the Palestinian Territories, where the FPSC has a greater presence and activity.

FPSC is present in Jordan since 1994, when a project aimed at generating employment and the training of women was implemented. Since that intervention, the Foundation has managed projects in Jordan, that have been funded by AECID, Generalitat Valenciana, Reina Sofia Foundation, OFID, OCHA and EU.

Those activities had a greater impact on the **Care for the Disabled and vulnerable groups, Education, Water Resources, Accessibility, Microfinance and employment sectors**. In 2003, in the field of **Humanitarian Aid** a project that enabled FPSC to take care of more than 15.000 Iraqi refugees was carried out.

Some of the interventions implemented have a regional character, including Lebanon, Palestinian Territories, Egypt, Syria and Jordan. These interventions, apart from targeting Jordanians, try also to seek solutions to the different social problems with a regional dimension, promoting the work carried out by the local organizations and civil society leadership.

Additional Sector Information

FPSC Response to the Syrian crisis in Jordan:

In the three governorates of Ramtha, Karak and Ma'an, through an outreach unit, FPSC is distributing mobility aids, assistive tools and medical braces to Syrian refugees and to vulnerable Jordanians. Along with the provision of items, FPSC is also conducting an awareness campaign on the conditions, treatments and rights of people with disabilities.

FPSC is implementing an emergency project in Zaatari refugee camp as well to support Syrian refugees with disabilities. This project consists of a mobile clinic suitable for providing therapeutic services as well as mobility aids and assistive tools to the persons in need: wheelchairs, special wooden wheelchairs for cerebral palsy, standing frames, crutches, etc and medical braces such as orthoses and prostheses, etc. It will provide maintenance services for used equipment as well. Also, in the FPSC Space, PT sessions are provided to the CP cases.

FPSC is also appealing for funds for recreational activities for PwDs in Zaatari Camp and in the host communities, specifically in collaboration with the CACs (Community Action Committees).

FPSC is working also on an Accessibility Program started in 2010 in order to improve the social integration of disabled people in the Middle East through accessibility. This is a regional project implemented in Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria. It aims to establish adaptation units, vocational training workshops, and will carry on training staff members on topics such as accessibility, design and production.

Geographic Focus

In 2014, FPSC has appealed for funds in Protection for the following areas of intervention: Ramtha, Amman, Zarqa, Karak and Ma'an governorates, as well as for Zaatari camp.

FPSC has an office in Amman and a compound in Zaatari Camp, the FPSC Space, in District 10.
